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10	WHEREAS, many individuals affected by brain injuries, post-traumatic stress disorder, or dementia
11	require specialized long-term treatment and care; and
12	WHEREAS, individuals affected by brain injuries, post-traumatic stress disorder, and dementia may
13	be placed in assisted living facilities or other congregate care living arrangements; and
14	WHEREAS, in some cases, individuals affected by brain injury, post-traumatic stress disorder, or
15	dementia experience increases in aggression and impulsivity, which makes placement in assisted living
16	facilities or other congregate care living facilities undesirable or unsafe; and
17 18	WHEREAS, access to housing and treatment options for individuals affected by brain injuries,
10 19	post-traumatic stress disorder, or dementia who experience aggression and impulsivity is often limited; now, therefore, be it
<b>20</b>	RESOLVED by the Senate, the House of Delegates concurring, That the Joint Commission on Health
<b>20</b> <b>21</b>	Care be directed to study placement options for individuals with brain injury, post-traumatic stress
22	disorder, or dementia who experience aggression.
$\frac{22}{23}$	In conducting its study, the Joint Commission on Health Care shall identify the various placement
24	options for individuals with brain injury, post-traumatic stress disorder, or dementia who experience
25	aggression; identify the barriers to placement for individuals with brain injury, post-traumatic stress
26	disorder, or dementia who experience aggression; and make recommendations for improving access to
27	safe, appropriate placements for individuals with brain injury, post-traumatic stress disorder, or dementia
28	who experience aggression.
29	All agencies of the Commonwealth shall provide assistance to the Joint Commission on Health Care
30	for this study, upon request.
31	The Joint Commission on Health Care shall complete its meetings for the first year by November 30,
32	2016, and for the second year by November 30, 2017, and the chairman shall submit to the Division of
33	Legislative Automated Systems an executive summary of its findings and recommendations no later than
34	the first day of the next Regular Session of the General Assembly for each year. Each executive
35	summary shall state whether the Joint Commission on Health Care intends to submit to the General
36	Assembly and the Governor a report of its findings and recommendations for publication as a House or
37	Senate document. The executive summaries and reports shall be submitted as provided in the procedures
38	of the Division of Legislative Automated Systems for the processing of legislative documents and
