**2. Patron:** Massie

**3. Committee:** Passed both houses.

**4. Title:** Sexual assault response teams; participants; FOIA exclusion.

**5. Summary:** Adds the Title IX coordinator; representatives from the office of student affairs, human resources, and counseling services; and a representative of campus security, of any institution of higher education in the jurisdiction, to the list of persons invited to participate in the annual meeting of a sexual assault response team. The bill also excludes the records of meetings of a sexual assault response team in which individual cases are discussed from mandatory disclosure under the Virginia Freedom of Information Act, but allows findings to be disclosed as part of statistical or aggregate data that does not identify individuals.

**6. Budget Amendment Necessary:** No.

**7. No Fiscal Impact:** Final. See Item 8.

**8. Fiscal Implications:** This legislation should have no fiscal impact. Institutions of higher education should be able to furnish the representatives for the annual meetings of the sexual response team within current operations, at no additional cost. Excluding records of sexual response teams from being subject to the Virginia Freedom of Information Act should have no fiscal impact on the state.

**9. Specific Agency or Political Subdivisions Affected:** Sexual response team of each political subdivision, institutions of higher education.
