**4. Title:** Issuance of certain special license plates

**5. Summary:** This bill prohibits the Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV) from issuing to registered sex offenders special license plates and personalized license plates that references children or children's programs, or if any revenue-sharing provision authorized for such special license plates contributes, directly or indirectly, to any fund or program established for the benefit of children. The bill would also prevent renewing the registration for a vehicle that has been issued such license plates.

**8. Fiscal Implications:** This legislation would require DMV to create notifications in electronic systems noting that individuals listed on the Sex Offender and Crimes Against Minors Registry are not eligible for certain special license plates and personalized license plates. The necessary system modifications will cost approximately \$41,391 in systems programming, which DMV can absorb with normal operating budgets.
