**4. Title:** Dogs injuring, chasing, or killing livestock or poultry.

Summary:** This bill allows the district court to order that any dog that has been found to have injured or killed only poultry be microchipped and either confined securely or transferred to another owner whom the court deems appropriate. Under current law, the court is required to order that such a dog be killed immediately or removed to another state.
