**2. Patron:** Massie

**3. Committee:** Passed both houses.

**4. Title:** Private institutions of higher education; memoranda of understanding; sexual assaults.

**5. Summary:** Clarifies that nonprofit private institutions of higher education that have security departments instead of campus police forces are required to enter into a memorandum of understanding with a law-enforcement agency that requires such agency to notify the local attorney for the Commonwealth within 48 hours of beginning any investigation involving felony criminal sexual assault occurring on campus property or other property related to the institution.

**6. Budget Amendment Necessary:** No.

**7. No Fiscal Impact:** Final. See item 8.

**8. Fiscal Implications:** This bill is a technical change to align the language of this section of code with similar sections concerning sexual assault on campus. All private institutions (including nonprofit institutions) of higher education are currently subject to these provisions under section 23-234 of the Code of Virginia. This legislation should have no fiscal impact because private nonprofit institutions are already subject to section 23-234 as currently written.

**9. Specific Agency or Political Subdivisions Affected:** Private nonprofit institutions of higher education in Virginia, Virginia's law enforcement agencies, Commonwealth's attorneys.
