The proposed legislation would prohibit the director of the Department of Corrections, sheriff, or any regional jail superintendent in which an alien is incarcerated, who receives a detainer from the U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement, from releasing the alien subject to the detainer except to transfer custody to another facility or to U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement. However, no alien may be held in custody beyond the date upon which he ordinarily would have been released, except in situations in which federal or state law requires that such alien be held in custody until transferred to an appropriate federal authority.
