**4. Title:** Disclosure of real-time location data in emergencies.

**5. Summary** The proposal provides that an investigative or law-enforcement officer may obtain real-time location data from an electronic communication service or remote computing service provider when the officer believes that an emergency involving immediate danger to a person requires such disclosure and a warrant for such disclosure cannot be obtained in time, regardless of whether the service provider also believes that such disclosure is required by the emergency. Currently, the law requires a service provider's determination whether such emergency requires disclosure without delay.

**8. Fiscal Implications:** The proposed legislation has no fiscal impact on the Department of State Police. The impact on local law enforcement agencies is indeterminate.
