4. Title: Child day programs; exemptions from licensure.

5. Summary: Child day programs; exemptions from licensure. Exempts from the child day program licensure requirements any martial arts program operated during the summer months if children under the age of five do not attend, the program operates between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m., and the program does not serve food or administer medicine to program participants unless it is necessary for the well-being of the child.

8. Fiscal Implications: This bill adds summer martial arts programs, which meet certain conditions, to the list of childcare program exempt from licensure by the Department of Social Services. Currently, the Department is unaware of any licensed child day programs that meet the new exemption requirements in this bill, and it is unknown how many martial arts programs could potentially qualify for this exemption in the future. It is estimated that any potential revenue impact from a reduction of licensing fees would be minimal.
