**3. Committee:** Transportation

**4. Title:** Revenue sharing special license plates

**5. Summary:** This bill allows any entity or organization that does not otherwise qualify under current law for a revenue sharing special license plate to obtain such plate, provided that the revenue is used for elementary or secondary education.

**6. Budget Amendment Necessary:** No.

**7. Fiscal Impact Estimates:** Indeterminate. See Item #8.

**8. Fiscal Implications:** The legislation expands existing criteria for organizations or entities that would be eligible to sponsor revenue-sharing special plates. The bill does not authorize any new revenue-sharing special plates, and as thus, would have no immediate fiscal impact on the Department of Motor Vehicles. It cannot be determined if this would lead to an increase in the authorization of revenue-sharing special plates in the future. The General Assembly would still be required to authorize a revenue-sharing special plate for a group made eligible under this legislation.
