4. Title: Rights of persons with disabilities in public places and places of public accommodation.

5. Summary: The bill provides that anyone who knowingly represents a dog as a service dog, through a harness, collar, vest, sign, or identification card, in order to gain public access for such dog is guilty of a Class 4 misdemeanor.

8. Fiscal Implications: Anyone convicted of a Class 4 misdemeanor is subject to a fine of not more than \$250; there is no jail time for a Class 4 misdemeanor. All revenue from fines is required to be deposited in the Literary Fund. It is not feasible to project the amount of additional revenue from fines that may be collected as a result of the proposed legislation.
