**4. Title:** Alcoholic beverage control; consumption of samples by brewery tour guides

**5. Summary:** Requires the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board to adopt regulations that prescribe the terms and conditions under which tour guides employed by certain licensed breweries may consume up to three four-ounce samples of beer while conducting tours of the premises for the purpose of featuring and educating the public about the beer being tasted.

**8. Fiscal Implications:** Currently, § 4.1-325.2 prohibits retail licensee (or their agents or employees) from consuming alcoholic beverages while on duty and in a position that is involved in the selling or serving of alcoholic beverages to customers. The proposed legislation would allow tour guides to sell and consume alcoholic beverages. According to the Department of Alcoholic Beverage Control (ABC), the implementation of this legislation is expected to have a moderate impact on the agency's enforcement operations as the term "tour guides" is not currently defined and new regulations would need to be drafted and circulated.
