4. Title: Clinical rotations in a medically underserved area

5. Summary: The legislation directs any public institution of higher education that awards medical degrees to create and support at least one clinical rotation in a hospital or clinic located in a medically underserved area that has an unemployment rate of one and one-half times the statewide average unemployment rate, or in a locality with a population of 50,000 or less in the Commonwealth as determined by the Virginia Department of Health.

8. Fiscal Implications: According to representatives from each of the three medical schools, all are currently supporting multiple clinical rotations that support this legislation within existing resources. The legislation codifies existing practices at the three medical schools and will not require any additional funding.
