Summary: Increases the membership of the Common Interest Community Board from 11 to 14 by adding (i) one member who serves or has served on the governing board of a common interest community that is not professionally managed at the time of appointment and (ii) two members who reside in a common interest community.

Fiscal Implications: This bill increases the administrative and regulatory responsibilities of the Department of Professional and Occupational Regulation (DPOR) by requiring the addition of three members to the Common Interest Community Board (Board). The Board conducts at least four meetings per year. Board member travel costs to attend meetings are estimated at \$700 per year. Total costs are expected to increase \$2,100 annually as a result of this bill.
