**4. Title:** Concealed Carry Reciprocity Advisory Commission.

**5. Summary:** The proposal establishes the Concealed Carry Reciprocity Advisory Commission (the Commission) as a legislative commission. The Commission will review the laws of other states to determine whether the Commonwealth should recognize concealed handgun or concealed weapon permits in other states and will approve the entering into and rescinding of reciprocity agreements with other states. The bill provides that until December 31, 2016, the Superintendent of State Police shall recognize any valid concealed handgun or concealed weapon permit or license issued by another state where such state's permit or license was, as of December 31, 2015, recognized by the Superintendent of State Police as authorizing the holder of such permit or license to carry a concealed handgun in the Commonwealth.

**8. Fiscal Implications:** The proposed Commission consists of six legislative members, two members of the Senate and four members of the House of Delegates. The Commission's meetings are to be held at the call of the chairman or whenever the majority of the members request a meeting. Members are to be reimbursed for reasonable and necessary expenses incurred in the performance of their duties.

The total annual fiscal impact from the proposal is estimated at \$8,760. The estimated cost impact for the House of Delegates is \$5,840 (based on four legislative members and assumed four meetings held per year), and the estimated cost impact for the Senate is \$2,920 (based on two members and assumed four meetings held per year).

The Division of Legislative Services at the General Assembly and Virginia State Police do not anticipate fiscal impact on its operations from the proposal.

**9. Specific Agency or Political Subdivisions Affected:** The General Assembly, Division of Legislative Services, the Department of State Police, and local law enforcement agencies.
