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11	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
12	1. That § 3, as amended, and § 6 of Chapter 571 of the Acts of Assembly of 1997 are amended and
13	reenacted as follows:
14	§ 3. Election of the mayor and council persons; vacancies; time of meeting; appointment of
15	vice-mayor.
16	A. Notwithstanding the provisions of § 24.2-222 of the Code of Virginia, on the first Tuesday in
17	November in each even-numbered year, there shall be elected a mayor and three council persons from
18	the town at large, as well as council persons to fill vacancies, if any, whose terms of office shall begin
19	on the first day of January following such election, but in cases of filling vacancies, the term shall begin
20	immediately, and they shall serve until their successors shall be duly elected and qualify. In order to
21	transition from a May to November election date, any mayor or council person elected in 1996 for a
22	four-year term, or in 1998 for a two-year term, shall hold office until his successor has qualified. His
23	successor shall be elected on the Tuesday after the first Monday in November 2000 and shall take office
24	on the January 1 following his election. Any council person elected in 1998 for a four-year term shall
25	hold office until his successor has qualified. His successor shall be elected on the Tuesday after the first
26	Monday in November 2002 and shall take office on the January 1 following his election.
27	B. The mayor shall be elected for a term of two years; council persons shall serve for terms of four
28	years each.
29	C. The council shall be a continuing body, and no measure pending before such body shall abate or
30	be discontinued by reason of expiration of the term of office of the council persons or any member.
31	Vacancies in the council shall be filled for the unexpired terms by a majority vote of the remaining
32	members until the next ensuing regularly scheduled general election for the office, or, if the vacancy
33	occurs within 120 days of such regularly scheduled general election, at the second such ensuing election.
34	The present mayor and council persons shall continue in office until the expiration of the term for which
35	they were respectively elected.
36	D. The council shall, by ordinance, fix the time for the regular meetings. Special meetings shall be
37	called by the clerk of the council upon request of the mayor or any three council persons; reasonable
38	notice of each special meeting shall be given each member of the council; no business shall be
39	transacted at a special meeting except that for which the special meeting is called, unless the council is
40	unanimous.
41	<i>E. The council may, by ordinance, appoint one of its members to serve as vice-mayor during his or</i>
42	her term of office.
43	§ 6. Powers and duties of the mayor and vice-mayor.
4 4	The mayor shall preside at the meetings of the council and perform such other duties as may be
45	prescribed by this charter and by general law and such as may be imposed by the council consistent
4 5 4 6	with the office. The mayor shall be entitled to vote upon measures pending before the council only in
40 47	the event that the other members voting are equally divided for and against such measure. The
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	vice-mayor shall possess all the powers and discharge the duties of the mayor in the event of the
49 50	mayor's absence or inability to act. During such temporary service, the vice-mayor shall retain his or
50	her right to vote as a council person and shall not be deemed to have vacated his or her council office.

INTRODUCED
