11	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
12	1. That § 54.1-3408.01 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted and that the Code of
13	Virginia is amended by adding a section numbered 54.1-3410.3 as follows:
14	§ 54.1-3408.01. Requirements for prescriptions.
15	A. The written prescription referred to in § 54.1-3408 shall be written with ink or individually typed
16	or printed. The prescription shall contain the name, address, and telephone number of the prescriber. A
17	prescription for a controlled substance other than one controlled in Schedule VI shall also contain the
18	federal controlled substances registration number assigned to the prescriber. The prescriber's information
19 20	shall be either preprinted upon the prescription blank, electronically printed, typewritten, rubber stamped,
20 21	or printed by hand. The written prescription shall contain the first and last name of the patient for whom the drug is
22	prescribed and the purpose for which the drug is prescribed. The address of the patient shall either be
23	placed upon the written prescription <i>either</i> by the prescribed. The dedress of the patient shall enter be placed upon the written prescription <i>either</i> by the prescriber or his agent, or by the dispenser of the
24	prescription. If not otherwise prohibited by law, the dispenser may record the address of the patient in
25	an electronic prescription dispensing record for that patient in lieu of recording it on the prescription.
26	Each written prescription shall be dated as of, and signed by the prescriber on, the day when issued. The
27	prescription may be prepared by an agent for the prescriber's signature.
28	This section shall not prohibit a prescriber from using preprinted prescriptions for drugs classified in
29 30	Schedule VI if all requirements concerning dates, signatures, and other information specified above are
30 31	otherwise fulfilled. No written prescription order form shall include more than one prescription. However, this provision
32	shall not apply (i) to prescriptions written as chart orders for patients in hospitals and long-term-care
33	facilities, patients receiving home infusion services, or hospice patients, $\Theta$ ; (ii) to a prescription ordered
34	through a pharmacy operated by or for the Department of Corrections or the Department of Juvenile
35	Justice, the central pharmacy of the Department of Health, or the central outpatient pharmacy operated
36	by the Department of Behavioral Health and Developmental Services; or (iii) to prescriptions written for
37	patients residing in adult and juvenile detention centers, local or regional jails, or work release centers
38	operated by the Department of Corrections.
39 40	B. Prescribers' orders, whether written as chart orders or prescriptions, for Schedules II, III, IV, and
40 41	V controlled drugs to be administered to (i) patients or residents of long-term care facilities served by a Virginia pharmacy from a remote location or (ii) patients receiving parenteral, intravenous,
42	intramuscular, subcutaneous, or intraspinal infusion therapy and served by a home infusion pharmacy
43	from a remote location, may be transmitted to that remote pharmacy by an electronic communications
44	device over telephone lines which send the exact image to the receiver in hard copy form, and such
45	facsimile copy shall be treated as a valid original prescription order. If the order is for a
46	radiopharmaceutical, a physician authorized by state or federal law to possess and administer medical
47	radioactive materials may authorize a nuclear medicine technologist to transmit a prescriber's verbal or
48	written orders for radiopharmaceuticals.
49 50	C. The oral prescription referred to in § 54.1-3408 shall be transmitted to the pharmacy of the
50 51	patient's choice by the prescriber or his authorized agent. For the purposes of this section, an authorized agent of the prescriber shall be an employee of the prescriber who is under his immediate and personal
51 52	supervision, or if not an employee, an individual who holds a valid license allowing the administration
53	or dispensing of drugs and who is specifically directed by the prescriber.
54	§ 54.1-3410.3. Labeling of dispensed drugs; purpose.
55	Pursuant to regulations adopted by the Board any drug dispensed pursuant to a prescription shall

56 include on the label of the container in which the dispensed drug is placed the purpose for which the
57 drug has been prescribed.
