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8	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
9	1. That § 33.2-1808 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows:
10	§ 33.2-1808. Comprehensive agreement.
11	A. Prior to developing and/or operating the qualifying transportation facility, the private entity shall
12	enter into a comprehensive agreement with the responsible public entity. The comprehensive agreement
13	shall, as appropriate, provide for:
14	1. Delivery of performance and payment bonds in connection with the development and/or operation
15	of the qualifying transportation facility, in the forms and amounts satisfactory to the responsible public
16	entity;
17	2. Review of plans for the development and/or operation of the qualifying transportation facility by
18	the responsible public entity and approval by the responsible public entity if the plans conform to
19	standards acceptable to the responsible public entity;
20	3. Inspection of construction of or improvements to the qualifying transportation facility by the
21 22	responsible public entity to ensure that such construction or improvements conform to the standards
22 23	acceptable to the responsible public entity; 4. Maintenance of a policy or policies of public liability insurance (copies of which shall be filed
23 24	with the responsible public entity accompanied by proofs of coverage) or self-insurance, each in form
25 25	and amount satisfactory to the responsible public entity and reasonably sufficient to insure coverage of
23 26	tort liability to the public and employees and to enable the continued operation of the qualifying
20 27	transportation facility;
28	5. Monitoring of the maintenance practices of the private entity by the responsible public entity and
29	the taking of such actions as the responsible public entity finds appropriate to ensure that the qualifying
30	transportation facility is properly maintained;
31	6. Reimbursement to be paid to the responsible public entity for services provided by the responsible
32	public entity;
33	7. Filing of appropriate financial statements in a form acceptable to the responsible public entity on a
34	periodic basis;
35	8. Compensation to the private entity that may include a reasonable development fee, a reasonable
36	maximum rate of return on investment, and/or reimbursement of development expenses in the event of
37	termination for convenience by the responsible public entity as agreed upon between the responsible
38	public entity and the private entity;
<b>39</b>	9. The date of termination of the private entity's authority and duties under this chapter and
40 41	dedication to the appropriate public entity; and
42	10. Guaranteed cost and completion guarantees related to the development and/or operation of the qualified transportation facility and payment of damages for failure to meet the completion guarantee.
43	B. The comprehensive agreement shall provide for such user fees as may be established by
44	agreement of the parties. Any user fees shall be set at a level that takes into account any lease
45	payments, service payments, and compensation to the private entity or as specified in the comprehensive
46	agreement. A copy of any service contract shall be filed with the responsible public entity. A schedule
47	of the current user fees shall be made available by the private entity to any member of the public on
48	request. In negotiating user fees under this section, the parties shall establish fees that are the same for
49	persons using the facility under like conditions except as required by agreement between the parties to
50	preserve capacity and prevent congestion on the qualifying transportation facility. The execution of the
51	comprehensive agreement or any amendment thereto shall constitute conclusive evidence that the user
52	fees provided for therein comply with this chapter. User fees established in the comprehensive
53	agreement as a source of revenues may be in addition to or in lieu of service payments.
54	C. In the comprehensive agreement, the responsible public entity may agree to make grants or loans
55	for the development and/or operation of the qualifying transportation facility from amounts received
56	from the federal government or any agency or instrumentality thereof.

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D. The comprehensive agreement shall incorporate the duties of the private entity under this chapter 57

and may contain such other terms and conditions that the responsible public entity determines serve the 58 59 public purpose of this chapter. Without limitation, the comprehensive agreement may contain provisions 60 under which the responsible public entity agrees to provide notice of default and cure rights for the 61 benefit of the private entity and the persons specified therein as providing financing for the qualifying transportation facility. The comprehensive agreement may contain such other lawful terms and 62 63 conditions to which the private entity and the responsible public entity mutually agree, including provisions regarding unavoidable delays or provisions providing for a loan of public funds for the 64 development and/or operation of one or more qualifying transportation facilities. 65

E. The comprehensive agreement shall provide for the distribution of any earnings in excess of the maximum rate of return as negotiated in the comprehensive agreement. Without limitation, excess earnings may be distributed to the Transportation Trust Fund, to the responsible public entity, or to the private entity for debt reduction or they may be shared with appropriate public entities. Any payments under a concession arrangement for which the Commonwealth is the responsible public entity shall be paid into the Transportation Trust Fund.

F. Any changes in the terms of the comprehensive agreement, as may be agreed upon by the parties,shall be added to the comprehensive agreement by written amendment.

G. Notwithstanding any contrary provision of this chapter, a responsible public entity may enter into
a comprehensive agreement with multiple private entities if the responsible public entity determines in
writing that it is in the public interest to do so.

H. The comprehensive agreement may provide for the development and/or operation of phases or segments of the qualifying transportation facility.

*I.* [*The* Any ] comprehensive agreement [*originally entered into on or after July 1, 2017,*] *shall include* [, *in consultation with the Virginia State Police,*] *a provision requiring funding for adequate* 

81 staffing by the Virginia State Police for general law enforcement services during both development and

82 operation of the qualifying transportation facility. As used in this subsection, "adequate staffing" means

83 a level of staffing in accordance with the Trooper Allocation and Distribution Model as developed

84 pursuant to Item 459(g) of Chapter 1042 of the Acts of Assembly of 2003.
