6	A BILL to amend and reenact § 8.01-223.2 of the Code of Virginia, relating to immunity of persons;
7	defamation; statements regarding matters of public concern communicated to a third party;
8	statements made at a public hearing.
9	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
10	1. That § 8.01-223.2 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows:
11	§ 8.01-223.2. Immunity of persons for statements made at public hearing or communicated to
12	third party.
13	A. For purposes of this section, "matters of public concern" means matters of interest to the
14	community, which are written or spoken statements relating to (i) an issue properly before a governing
15	body; (ii) an issue reasonably likely to encourage consideration or review by a governing body; or (iii)
16	a good, product, or service in the marketplace.
17	<i>B</i> . A person shall be immune from civil liability for a violation of § 18.2-499 or, a claim of tortious
18	interference with an existing contract or a business or contractual expectancy, or a claim of defamation
19	based solely on statements made by that person (i) regarding matters of public concern that are
20	communicated to a third party or (ii) made at a public hearing before the governing body of any
21	locality or other political subdivision, or the boards, commissions, agencies and authorities thereof, and
22	other governing bodies of any local governmental entity concerning matters properly before such body.
23	The immunity provided by this section shall not apply to any statements made with knowledge that they
24	are false, or reckless disregard for whether they are false.
25	C. Any person who has a suit against him dismissed pursuant to the immunity provided by this
