10 11	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia: 1. That § 30-178 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows:
12	§ 30-178. Virginia Freedom of Information Advisory Council; membership; terms; quorum;
12	expenses.
14	A. The Virginia Freedom of Information Advisory Council (the Council) is hereby created as an
15	advisory council in the legislative branch to encourage and facilitate compliance with the Freedom of
16	Information Act (§ 2.2-3700 et seq.).
17	B. The Council shall consist of 12 14 members as follows: the Attorney General or his designee; the
18	Librarian of Virginia or his designee; the Director of the Division of Legislative Services or his
19	designee; four five members appointed by the Speaker of the House of Delegates, one two of whom
20	shall be a member members of the House of Delegates, and three nonlegislative citizen members, at
21	least one of whom shall be or have been a representative of the news media; three four members
22	appointed by the Senate Committee on Rules, one two of whom shall be a member members of the
23	Senate, one of whom shall be or have been an officer of local government, and one nonlegislative
24	citizen at-large member; and two nonlegislative citizen members appointed by the Governor, one of
25 26	whom shall not be a state employee. The local government representative may be selected from a list
20 27	recommended by the Virginia Association of Counties and the Virginia Municipal League, after due consideration of such list by the Senate Committee on Rules. The citizen members may be selected from
28	a list recommended by the Virginia Press Association, the Virginia Association of Broadcasters, and the
2 9	Virginia Coalition for Open Government, after due consideration of such list by the appointing
30	authorities.
31	C. All appointments following the initial staggering of terms shall be for terms of four years, except
32	that appointments to fill vacancies shall be for the unexpired terms in the same manner as the original
33	appointment. No nonlegislative citizen member shall be eligible to serve for more than two successive
34	four-year terms. However, after the expiration of a term of three years or less, or after the expiration of
35	the remainder of a term to which appointed to fill a vacancy, two additional terms may be served by
36	such member if appointed thereto. Legislative members and other state government officials shall serve
37	terms coincident with their terms of office. Legislative members may be reappointed for successive
38	terms.
39 40	D. The members of the Council shall elect from among their membership a chairman and a vice-chairman for two-year terms. The chairman and vice-chairman may not succeed themselves to the
40	same position.
42	<i>E.</i> The Council shall hold meetings quarterly or upon the call of the chairman. A majority of the
43	Council shall constitute a quorum. Notwithstanding the provisions of subsection C, if any nonlegislative
44	citizen member of the Council fails to attend three or more meetings of the Council in a calendar year,
45	the Council shall notify the member's appointing authority. Upon receipt of such notification, the
46	appointing authority shall remove the member and appoint a successor as soon as practicable.
47	E. F. Members of the Council shall receive no compensation for their services but shall be
48	reimbursed for all reasonable and necessary expenses incurred in the performance of their duties as
49	provided in §§ 2.2-2813, 2.2-2825 and 30-19.12, as appropriate. Funding for expenses of the members
50	shall be provided from existing appropriations to the Council.
