6	A BILL to amend the Code of Virginia by adding in Title 15.2 a chapter numbered 67.1, consisting of
7	sections numbered 15.2-6705 through 15.2-6709, relating to the Virginia Coal Train Heritage
8 9	Authority. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
9 10	1. That the Code of Virginia is amended by adding in Title 15.2 a chapter numbered 67.1,
11	consisting of sections numbered 15.2-6705 through 15.2-6709, as follows:
12	CHAPTER 67.1.
13	VIRGINIA COAL TRAIN HERITAGE AUTHORITY.
14	§ 15.2-6705. Virginia Coal Train Heritage Authority established; purpose.
15	The Virginia Coal Train Heritage Authority, referred to in this chapter as "the Authority," is created
16	as a body politic and corporate, a political subdivision of the Commonwealth. As such it shall have, and
17	is hereby vested with, the powers and duties conferred in this chapter.
18	The purpose of the Authority shall be limited to developing tourism projects in the Counties of
19 20	Dickenson, Russell, and Wise related to the Clinchfield Railroad. § 15.2-6706. Board of the Authority; qualifications; terms; quorum; records.
20 21	A. All powers, rights, and duties conferred by this chapter, or other provisions of law, upon the
22	Authority shall be exercised by the Board of the Virginia Coal Train Heritage Authority ("the board").
23	B. The board shall consist of 14 members as follows: one member of the governing body of each of
24	the Counties of Dickenson, Russell, and Wise, each appointed by the respective governing body; one
25	citizen member appointed by the governing body of each of the Counties of Dickenson, Russell, and
26	Wise, each of whom shall be a resident of the appointing county and not a member of the county
27	governing body; one citizen member appointed by the governing body of each of the Towns of Clinchco,
28	Haysi, and St. Paul, each of whom shall be a resident of the appointing town; two commissioners of the
29 30	Breaks Interstate Park Commission, appointed by that Commission; one at-large member who shall be a Virginia resident and have experience in the excursion train business, appointed by a majority vote of
30 31	the board; and two members of the General Assembly representing any part of the County of Dickenson,
32	Russell, or Wise, who shall serve ex officio with voting privileges.
33	C. Initial appointments to the board shall begin July 1, 2017. Each board member shall serve for a
34	term of four years and may be reappointed for additional terms. The term of any member of the board
35	shall immediately terminate if the member no longer meets the eligibility criteria of the initial
36	appointment. Vacancies shall be filled for the unexpired term. The members of the board shall receive
37	no salary, unless specifically authorized by the governing bodies of Dickenson, Russell, and Wise
38 39	Counties.
40	D. Seven members of the board shall constitute a quorum of the board for the purposes of conducting its business and exercising its powers and for all other purposes. No vacancy in the
41	membership of the board shall impair the right of a quorum to exercise all the powers and perform all
42	the duties of the board.
43	E. The board shall elect from its membership a chairman, a vice-chairman, and from its membership
44	or not, as they desire, a secretary and a treasurer, or a secretary-treasurer, who shall continue to hold
45	such office until their respective successors are elected.
46	F. The board shall keep detailed minutes of its proceedings, which shall be open to public inspection
47 48	at all times. It shall keep suitable records of its financial transactions and, unless exempted by § 30-140, it shall arrange to have the records audited annually. Copies of each such audit shall be furnished to
4 9	the governing bodies of Dickenson, Russell, and Wise Counties and the Auditor of Public Accounts and
50	shall be open to public inspection.
51	G. A local governing body may remove from the board any member it has appointed in the event
52	that the board member is absent from any three consecutive board meetings or is absent from any four
53	board meetings within any 12-month period. In either such event, the local governing body shall appoint
54 55	a successor for the unexpired portion of the term of the member who has been removed.
55 56	§ 15.2-6707. Executive director; staff. The Authority shall appoint an executive director, who shall be authorized to employ such staff as
50 57	necessary to enable the Authority to perform its duties as set forth in this chapter. The Authority is
58	authorized to determine the duties of such staff and to fix salaries and compensation from such funds as

60 § 15.2-6708. Powers of Authority.

The Authority shall have the following powers to carry out and effectuate its purpose, together with 61 62 all powers incidental thereto or necessary for the performance of those hereinafter stated:

63 1. To sue and be sued and to prosecute and defend, at law or in equity, in any court having jurisdiction of the subject matter and of the parties; 64 65

2. To adopt and use a corporate seal and to alter the same at pleasure;

3. To contract and be contracted with:

4. To employ and pay compensation to such employees and agents, including attorneys, as the board 67 deems necessary in carrying on the business of the Authority; 68

5. To establish bylaws and make all rules and regulations, not inconsistent with the provisions of this 69 70 chapter, deemed expedient for the management of the Authority's affairs;

6. To borrow money and to accept contributions, grants, and other financial assistance from the 71 United States government and agencies or instrumentalities thereof; the Commonwealth, or any political 72 73 subdivision, agency, or public instrumentality of the Commonwealth; or any private person, foundation, 74 or financial institution;

75 7. To issue revenue bonds in accordance with applicable law. Such bonds shall be secured solely by 76 revenues of the Authority;

8. To receive and expend moneys on behalf of tourist train development; and

78 9. To cooperate with any private or governmental entities in the states of West Virginia, Kentucky, 79 Tennessee, or North Carolina in the development of a tourist train and theme park.

80 § 15.2-6709. Authority of localities.

81 Localities are hereby authorized to lend or donate money or other property or services to the Authority for any of its purposes. The locality making the grant or loan may restrict the use of such 82

83 grants or loans to a specific project, within or outside that locality.
