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11	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
12	1. That the Code of Virginia is amended by adding a section numbered 2.2-2239.1 as follows:
13	§ 2.2-2239.1. Advisory Committee on Aerospace.
14	A. The Board shall establish an Advisory Committee on Aerospace (the Advisory Committee) to
15	advise the Board on all matters related to establishing the Commonwealth as a leader in the aerospace
16	sector, including economic development, marketing, workforce development, and research and
17	commercialization in the public and private aerospace sectors and related supply chain industries. In
18	advising the Board, the Advisory Committee shall:
19	1. Identify opportunities and recommend actions to use the economic development engine offered by
20	the Commonwealth's aerospace sector to benefit the sector and the Commonwealth, including the
21	attraction to Virginia of launch and other aerospace companies, as well as federal and international
22	investments, such as the Federal Aviation Administration's NextGen initiative and emerging NASA and
23	other federal programs;
24	2. Suggest strategies to (i) attract new aerospace companies to the Commonwealth and promote the
25	development of existing aerospace companies located in the Commonwealth, (ii) market the
26	Commonwealth's numerous assets related to the aerospace sector, and (iii) encourage and incentivize
27	applied research and technology that will contribute to the growth and development of the aerospace
28	sector in the Commonwealth;
29	3. Develop a long-term strategic plan to make the Mid-Atlantic Regional Spaceport the commercial
<b>3</b> 0	hub for space travel originating or concluding in the United States;
31	4. Contribute to the continued development of the Mid-Atlantic Regional Spaceport. Development
32	efforts shall include, in part:
33	a. Identification of any federal or state regulatory impediments, including taxation, to the
33 34	development of the Mid-Atlantic Regional Spaceport;
35	b. Identification of threats to the spaceport's viability, such as encroachment, zoning, mineral
36	exploration and exploitation, and noncompatible uses of the spaceport; and
37	c. Identification and recommendation of policy and legislative solutions to potential state legal
38	barriers to human spaceflight;

	5. Advise the Board on infrastructure and marketing investments needed to achieve the full potential
40	of Virginia's aerospace sector as a whole, including, but not limited to, the Mid-Atlantic Regional
41	Spaceport;
42	6. Identify and recommend policies to support the critical role of the Commonwealth's institutions of
43	higher education in providing human capital and research contributions that significantly advance the
44 45	economic development of aerospace-related and aerodynamic-dependent industries in the
45	Commonwealth; and
46	7. Identify and recommend policies to support aerospace sector needs for workforce development as
47	provided by the Virginia Community College System and precollege educational system, including
48	suggestions for enhanced development of Virginia's high-tech workforce pipeline in engineering,
<b>49</b>	technology, and science.
50	B. 1. The Advisory Committee shall have a total membership of 20 members that shall consist of four
51	legislative members, nine nonlegislative citizen members, and seven ex officio members. Members shall
52	be appointed as follows: three members of the House of Delegates, to be appointed by the Speaker of
53	the House of Delegates in accordance with the principles of proportional representation contained in the
54	Rules of the House of Delegates; one member of the Senate, to be appointed by the Senate Committee
55	on Rules; and nine nonlegislative citizen members, of whom one shall represent the Mid-Atlantic
56	Regional Spaceport, one shall represent Old Dominion University, one shall represent the University of
57	Virginia, one shall represent Virginia Polytechnic Institute and State University, and five shall represent
58	aerospace companies or suppliers within the Commonwealth, to be appointed by the Governor and serve

with voting privileges. The Director of the Department of Aviation, Director of the National Institute of 59 Aerospace, President and CEO of the Virginia Tourism Authority, Director of the Virginia Space Grant 60 61 Consortium, and President and CEO of the Virginia Economic Development Partnership, or their 62 designees, shall serve as ex officio members with voting privileges. A representative of NASA Wallops 63 Flight Facility and a representative of NASA Langley Research Center shall be requested to serve by 64 the Governor as ex officio members with nonvoting privileges. Nonlegislative members of the Advisory 65 Committee shall be citizens of the Commonwealth. 2. Legislative and ex officio members shall serve terms coincident with their terms of office. Other 66

67 members shall be appointed for terms of two years. Appointments to fill vacancies, other than by expiration of a term, shall be for the unexpired term. Vacancies shall be filled in the same manner as **68** the original appointments. All members may be reappointed. 69

70 3. Legislative members shall receive such compensation as provided in § 30-19.12. Nonlegislative 71 citizen members shall serve without compensation. Funding for compensation and expenses of legislative members shall be provided by the operating budgets of the Clerk of the House of Delegates and Clerk 72 of the Senate upon approval of the Joint Rules Committee. All other expenses of the Advisory Committee 73 74 shall be provided by the Authority.

75 4. The Advisory Committee shall elect a chairman and a vice-chairman annually from among its 76 legislative membership. A majority of the members shall constitute a quorum. The Advisory Committee 77 shall meet at such times as may be called by the chairman, a majority of the Advisory Committee, or 78 the Authority.

79 2. That Article 33 (§§ 2.2-2699.1 and 2.2-2699.2) of Chapter 26 of Title 2.2 of the Code of Virginia 80 is repealed.

3. That the provisions of this act shall not be construed to affect the unexpired terms of the 81 82

members serving on the Aerospace Advisory Council on June 30, 2017. Such members shall be deemed to be members of the Advisory Committee on Aerospace established pursuant to 83

§ 2.2-2239.1 of the Code of Virginia, as created by this act, and shall serve the remainder of their 84

85 terms.
