- 12 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
- 13 1. That § 2.2-2101, as it is currently effective and as it shall become effective, of the Code of 14 Virginia is amended and reenacted and that the Code of Virginia is amended by adding in 15 Chapter 31 of Title 23.1 an article numbered 9, consisting of sections numbered 23.1-3134, 16 23.1-3135, and 23.1-3136, as follows:
- \$ 2.2-2101. (Effective until July 1, 2017) Prohibition against service by legislators on boards,
 commissions, and councils within the executive branch; exceptions.
- 19 Members of the General Assembly shall be ineligible to serve on boards, commissions, and councils 20 within the executive branch of state government who are responsible for administering programs established by the General Assembly. Such prohibition shall not extend to boards, commissions, and 21 22 councils engaged solely in policy studies or commemorative activities. If any law directs the 23 appointment of any member of the General Assembly to a board, commission, or council in the 24 executive branch of state government that is responsible for administering programs established by the 25 General Assembly, such portion of such law shall be void, and the Governor shall appoint another 26 person from the Commonwealth at large to fill such a position.

Article 9.

89 Online Virginia Network Authority. 90 § 23.1-3134. Online Virginia Network Authority established; purpose; governing board; staff 91 support.

92 A. The Online Virginia Network Authority (the Authority) is established as an educational institution 93 in the Commonwealth for the purpose of providing a means for individuals to earn competency-based 94 degrees and credentials by improving the quality of and expanding access to online degree and 95 credential programs that are beneficial to citizens, institutions of higher education, and employers in the 96 Commonwealth.

97 B. The Authority shall be governed by a board that has a total membership of 17 members that shall 98 consist of six members of the House of Delegates to be appointed by the Speaker of the House of Delegates in accordance with the principles of proportional representation contained in the Rules of the 99 100 House of Delegates; four members of the Senate to be appointed by the Senate Committee on Rules; three nonlegislative citizen members to be appointed by the Governor; two nonlegislative citizen 101 members to be appointed by the board of visitors of George Mason University; and two nonlegislative 102 citizen members to be appointed by the board of visitors of Old Dominion University. Nonlegislative 103 104 citizen members of the Authority shall be citizens of the Commonwealth. 105

C. Legislative members of the Authority shall serve terms coincident with their terms of office.

106 D. Appointments to fill vacancies, other than by expiration of a term, shall be for the unexpired terms. Vacancies shall be filled in the same manner as the original appointments. All members may be 107 108 reappointed.

109 E. After the initial staggering of terms, nonlegislative citizen members shall be appointed for a term 110 of four years.

111 F. No House member shall serve more than four consecutive two-year terms, no Senate member shall 112 serve more than two consecutive four-year terms, and no nonlegislative citizen member shall serve more 113 than two consecutive four-year terms. The remainder of any term to which a member is appointed to fill 114 a vacancy shall not constitute a term in determining the member's eligibility for reappointment.

G. The Authority shall elect a chairman and vice-chairman from among its membership. A majority 115 of the members shall constitute a quorum. The meetings of the Authority shall be held at the call of the 116 chairman or whenever the majority of the members so request. 117

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H. Legislative members of the Authority shall receive such compensation as provided in § 30-19.12,
and nonlegislative citizen members shall receive such compensation for the performance of their duties
as provided in § 2.2-2813. All members shall be reimbursed for all reasonable and necessary expenses
incurred in the performance of their duties as provided in §§ 2.2-2813 and 2.2-2825. Funding for the
costs of compensation and expenses of the members shall be provided by the Authority.

123 I. The Council shall provide staff support to the Authority. All agencies of the Commonwealth shall provide assistance to the Authority, upon request.

125 § 23.1-3135. Scope; duties; funding.

A. Each public institution of higher education and each consortium of public institutions of higher
 education that offers online courses, online degree programs, or online credential programs shall offer
 any such course, degree program, or credential program through the Authority.

129 *B. The Authority shall:*

130 1. Act as the coordinating and administering entity for the delivery of each online course, degree
 131 program, and credential program identified in subsection A;

132 2. Ensure that each online course, degree program, and credential program that it offers is (i)
133 accredited by an accrediting agency that is recognized by the U.S. Department of Education and (ii)
134 authorized by the Council;

3. To the extent practicable, ensure that each online course, degree program, and credential program that it offers expands access to courses, degree programs, and credential programs to underserved populations based on income, race, geography, and age; focuses on competency-based education; is responsive to the employment demands and the societal needs of the Commonwealth; and uses technology in an efficient and cost-effective manner to promote flexibility for students to complete such courses, degree programs, and credential programs in various locations and at various paces;

141 4. Determine tuition and fee rates for the online courses, degree programs, and credential programs
142 that it offers and to the extent practicable, manage and reduce program costs by reducing textbook costs
143 through open access, reducing student fees, and reducing time-to-degree and time-to-credential;

144 5. Maintain a public website;

6. Establish a seamless enrollment and course scheduling infrastructure that ensures articulation
between the courses and programs that it offers and multiple start dates and year-round offerings for
courses that it offers;

148 7. Offer advising and academic support services to students; and

149 8. Employ such personnel as it deems necessary to assist it in carrying out the provisions of this 150 article.

151 C. Any moneys, including interest thereon, that have not been expended by the Authority by the end
 152 of each fiscal year shall not revert to the general fund but shall remain in the accounts of the Authority.
 153 § 23.1-3136. Procurement and Information Technology.

154 A. The Authority shall be exempt from the provisions of the Virginia Public Procurement Act (§ 2.2-4300 et seq.), except for § 2.2-4342, which shall not be construed to require compliance with the 155 156 prequalification application procedures of subsection B of § 2.2-4317, if it adopts and complies with 157 policies for the procurement of goods and services, including professional services, that (i) are based 158 upon competitive principles, (ii) in each instance seek competition to the maximum practical degree; (iii) 159 implement a system of competitive negotiation for professional services pursuant to §§ 2.2-4303.1 and 160 2.2-4302.2; (iv) prohibit discrimination in the solicitation and award of contracts based on the bidder's 161 or offeror's race, religion, color, sex, national origin, age, or disability or on any other basis prohibited 162 by state or federal law; (v) incorporate the prompt payment principles of §§ 2.2-4350 and 2.2-4354; (vi) consider the impact on correctional enterprises under § 53.1-47; (vii) provide that whenever solicitations 163 164 are made seeking competitive procurement of goods or services, it shall be a priority of the Authority to provide for fair and reasonable consideration of small, women-owned, and minority-owned businesses 165 and to promote and encourage a diversity of suppliers; and (viii) identify the public, educational, and 166 operational interests served by any procurement rule that deviates from procurement rules in the 167 168 Virginia Public Procurement Act (§ 2.2-4300 et seq.).

169 B. The Authority shall be exempt from the provisions governing the Virginia Information Technologies Agency in Chapter 20.1 (§ 2.2-2005 et seq.) of Title 2.2 and the provisions governing the 170 171 Information Technology Advisory Council in Article 35 (§ 2.2-2699.5 et seq.) of Chapter 26 of Title 2.2, 172 if it adopts and complies with policies and professional best practices regarding strategic planning for 173 information technology, project management, security, budgeting, infrastructure, and ongoing operations. 174 2. That the initial appointments of nonlegislative citizen members of the Online Virginia Network 175 Authority (§ 23.1-3134 et seq. of the Code of Virginia), as created by this act, shall be staggered as 176 follows: two members for a term of two years appointed by the board of visitors of George Mason University; two members for a term of three years appointed by the board of visitors of Old 177 178 Dominion University; and three members for a term of four years appointed by the Governor.
