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10	WHEREAS, telemental health is the use of electronic information and telecommunications
11	technologies to support the delivery of behavioral health services, including clinical care, patient and
12	professional health-related education, public health, and administration, at a distance by a variety of
13	mental health service providers, including psychiatrists, psychologists, social workers, psychiatric nurse
14	practitioners, licensed professional counselors, and licensed marriage and family therapists; and
15	WHEREAS, telemental health provides an opportunity to enhance access to and the provision of
16	mental health services in the Commonwealth; and
17	WHEREAS, telemental health models of care have demonstrated positive outcomes making
18	telemental health a viable and essential tool for bridging the existing care gap; and
19	WHEREAS, during 2016, expert advisory panels on system structure and financing and mental health
20	crisis response and emergency services established by the Joint Subcommittee Studying Mental Health
21	Services in the Commonwealth in the 21st Century jointly established a Telemental Health Work Group
22	to develop policy proposals to remove impediments to greater use of telemental health services; and
23	WHEREAS, in October 2016 the Telemental Health Work Group reported on 30 policy options to
24 25	address six specific barriers to greater use of telemental health services and provided 12 specific
25 26	recommendations for immediate consideration; and WHEREAS the Joint Subcommittee Studying Montel Health Services in the Commonwealth in the

3 0	RESOLVED by the House of Delegates, the Senate concurring, That the Joint Commission on Health
31	Care be directed to study options for increasing the use of telemental health services in the
32	Commonwealth. The Joint Commission on Health Care shall specifically study the issues and
33	recommendations set forth in the report of the Telemental Health Work Group of the Joint
34	Subcommittee Studying Mental Health Services in the Commonwealth in the 21st Century.
35	All agencies of the Commonwealth shall provide assistance to the Joint Commission on Health Care
36	for this study, upon request.
37	The Joint Commission on Health Care shall complete its meetings and report its findings to the Joint
38	Subcommittee Studying Mental Health Services in the Commonwealth in the 21st Century by November
39	1, 2017. The Chairman shall submit to the Division of Legislative Automated Systems an executive
40	summary of its findings and recommendations no later than the first day of the 2018 Regular Session of
41	the General Assembly. The executive summary shall state whether the Joint Commission on Health Care
42	intends to submit to the General Assembly and the Governor a report of its findings and
43	recommendations for publication as a House or Senate document. The executive summary and report
44	shall be submitted as provided in the procedures of the Division of Legislative Automated Systems for
45	the processing of legislative documents and reports and shall be posted on the General Assembly's
