10	WHEREAS, constitutional equality for women and men continues to be a timely issue in the United
11	States and worldwide, and a number of other nations have achieved constitutional equality for their
12	women and men; and
13	WHEREAS, Congress is in a unique position to judge the tenor of the nation; to be aware of the
14	political, social, and economic factors affecting the nation; and to be aware of the importance to the
15 16	nation of the proposed amendment; and WUEPEAS, the deadline for the Equal Dichte Amendment ratification is in the receiving clause and
10	WHEREAS, the deadline for the Equal Rights Amendment ratification is in the resolving clause and is not a part of the amendment proposed by Congress, thus allowing Congress to review and amend the
18	ratification deadline; and
10 19	WHEREAS, Congress passed a time extension for the Equal Rights Amendment on October 20,
20	1978, thus demonstrating a willingness to amend the deadline; and
2 1	WHEREAS, Senate Joint Resolution 15 and House Joint Resolution 51 were introduced during the
$\overline{22}$	114th Congress to remove the deadline for the ratification of the Equal Rights Amendment; now,
23	therefore, be it
24	RESOLVED by the House of Delegates, the Senate concurring, That the General Assembly support
25	legislation to remove the deadline for the ratification of the Equal Rights Amendment. The General
26	Assembly also supports legislation to pass a new deadline for ratification of the Equal Rights
27	Amendment; and, be it
28	RESOLVED FURTHER, That the Clerk of the House of Delegates transmit a copy of this resolution
29	to the members of the Virginia Congressional Delegation so that they may be apprised of the sense of
30	the General Assembly of Virginia in this matter.
