3	Designating February, in 2018 and in each succeeding year, as Self-Care Month in Virginia.

8	WHEREAS self-care is a lifelong daily habit of healthy lifestyle choices, good hygiene practices,
9	prevention of infection and illness, avoiding unhealthy choices, monitoring for signs and symptoms of
10	changes in health, knowing when to consult a health care practitioner, and knowing when it is
11	appropriate to self-treat conditions; and
12	WHEREAS the U.S. Food and Drug Administration deems over-the-counter medicines safe and
13	effective for the self-care treatment of minor acute and chronic health conditions and symptoms such as
14	pain, the common cold, allergies, and other conditions that impact large segments of the population; and
15	WHEREAS over-the-counter medicines are either developed as new nonprescription medicines or
16 17	switched from existing prescription medicines to provide greater empowerment to consumers; and WHEREAS over-the-counter, nonprescription medicines are self-care products that consumers
18	purchase in pharmacies, supermarkets, retail stores, and online; and
19	WHEREAS every dollar spent on over-the-counter medicines saves the United States health care
20	system between six and seven dollars, totaling \$102 billion in annual savings; and
21	WHEREAS nonprescription medicines help to ease the burden on health care practitioners,
22	eliminating unnecessary medical examinations that could be avoided with appropriate self-care; and
23	WHEREAS Virginia benefits when its citizens practice appropriate self-care, do not unnecessarily
24	visit health care practitioners, and are empowered by higher self-esteem, improved health, and reduced
25 26	use of health care services; and WHEREAS all Virginians are encouraged to take advantage of self-care's potential to improve
20 27	personal and public health, help save personal and public funds, and strengthen the sustainability of the
28	Virginia's health care system; and
<b>2</b> 9	WHEREAS achieving the full potential of self-care is a shared opportunity for consumers, health
30	care practitioners, policy makers, and regulators; now, therefore, be it
31	RESOLVED by the House of Delegates, the Senate concurring, That the General Assembly designate
32	February, in 2018 and in each succeeding year, as Self-Care Month in Virginia; and, be it
33	RESOLVED FURTHER, That the Clerk of the House of Delegates transmit a copy of this resolution
34	to the Virginia Board of Medicine so that members of the board may be apprised of the sense of the
35 36	General Assembly of Virginia in this matter; and, be it RESOLVED FINALLY, That the Clerk of the House of Delegates post the designation of this month
37	on the General Assembly's website.
