17105103D **SENATE BILL NO. 1021** 1 2 FLOOR AMENDMENT IN THE NATURE OF A SUBSTITUTE 3 (Proposed by Senator Barker 4 on February 3, 2017) 5 (Patron Prior to Substitute—Senator Barker) 6 A BILL to amend and reenact §§ 16.1-69.40:1 and 46.2-830.1 of the Code of Virginia, relating to 7 failure to obey highway sign where driver sleeping or resting; prepayable offense. 8 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia: 9 1. That §§ 16.1-69.40:1 and 46.2-830.1 of the Code of Virginia are amended and reenacted as 10 follows: 11 § 16.1-69.40:1. Traffic infractions within authority of traffic violations clerk; schedule of fines; prepayment of local ordinances. 12 A. The Supreme Court shall by rule, which may from time to time be amended, supplemented or 13 repealed, but which shall be uniform in its application throughout the Commonwealth, designate the 14 traffic infractions for which a pretrial waiver of appearance, plea of guilty and fine payment may be 15 accepted. Such designated infractions shall include violations of §§ 46.2-830.1, 46.2-878.2 and 16 46.2-1242 or any parallel local ordinances. Notwithstanding any rule of the Supreme Court, a person 17 charged with a traffic offense that is listed as prepayable in the Uniform Fine Schedule may prepay his 18 fines and costs without court appearance whether or not he was involved in an accident. The prepayable 19 20 fine amount for a violation of § 46.2-878.2 shall be \$200 plus an amount per mile-per-hour in excess of 21 posted speed limits, as authorized in § 46.2-878.3. 22 Such infractions shall not include: 23 1. Indictable offenses: 24 2. [Repealed.] 25 3. Operation of a motor vehicle while under the influence of intoxicating liquor or a narcotic or 26 habit-producing drug, or permitting another person, who is under the influence of intoxicating liquor or 27 a narcotic or habit-producing drug, to operate a motor vehicle owned by the defendant or in his custody 28 or control; 29 4. Reckless driving: 30 5. Leaving the scene of an accident; 31 6. Driving while under suspension or revocation of driver's license; 32 7. Driving without being licensed to drive. 33 8. [Repealed.] 34 B. An appearance may be made in person or in writing by mail to a clerk of court or in person 35 before a magistrate, prior to any date fixed for trial in court. Any person so appearing may enter a waiver of trial and a plea of guilty and pay the fine and any civil penalties established for the offense 36 37 charged, with costs. He shall, prior to the plea, waiver, and payment, be informed of his right to stand 38 trial, that his signature to a plea of guilty will have the same force and effect as a judgment of court, 39 and that the record of conviction will be sent to the Commissioner of the Department of Motor Vehicles 40 or the appropriate offices of the State where he received his license to drive. 41 C. The Supreme Court, upon the recommendation of the Committee on District Courts, shall 42 establish a schedule, within the limits prescribed by law, of the amounts of fines and any civil penalties to be imposed, designating each infraction specifically. The schedule, which may from time to time be 43 44 amended, supplemented or repealed, shall be uniform in its application throughout the Commonwealth. 45 Such schedule shall not be construed or interpreted so as to limit the discretion of any trial judge trying individual cases at the time fixed for trial. The rule of the Supreme Court establishing the schedule shall 46 47 be prominently posted in the place where the fines are paid. Fines and costs shall be paid in accordance with the provisions of this Code or any rules or regulations promulgated thereunder. **48** 49 D. Fines imposed under local traffic infraction ordinances that do not parallel provisions of state law 50 and fulfill the criteria set out in subsection A may be prepayable in the manner set forth in subsection B if such ordinances appear in a schedule entered by order of the local circuit courts. The chief judge of 51 each circuit may establish a schedule of the fines, within the limits prescribed by local ordinances, to be 52 53 imposed for prepayment of local ordinances designating each offense specifically. Upon the entry of 54 such order it shall be forwarded within 10 days to the Supreme Court of Virginia by the clerk of the 55 local circuit court. The schedule, which from time to time may be amended, supplemented or repealed, shall be uniform in its application throughout the circuit. Such schedule shall not be construed or 56 interpreted so as to limit the discretion of any trial judge trying individual cases at the time fixed for 57 trial. This schedule shall be prominently posted in the place where fines are paid. Fines and costs shall 58

be paid in accordance with the provisions of this Code or any rules or regulations promulgated

62 Upon the trial of a person charged with failure to obey a highway sign in violation of § 46.2-830 where the court finds that the violation resulted from the No driver of a vehicle having been parked or 63 stopped by the driver shall park or stop his vehicle on the shoulder or other portion of the highway not 64

ordinarily used for vehicular traffic *in violation of a highway sign* in order for the driver to sleep or rest, the court may, in lieu of convicting under § 46.2-830, find the driver guilty of violating this section, 65

66 which shall be a lesser-included offense of § 46.2-830. No demerit points shall be assigned pursuant to 67

the Uniform Demerit Point System for convictions a violation pursuant to this section. However, the 68

provisions of this section shall not apply if such vehicle is parked or stopped in such manner as to 69

impede or render dangerous the shoulder or other portion of the highway. 70
