That § 54.1-2400.1 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows:</li> <li>§ \$54.1-2400.1. Mental health service providers; duty to protect third parties; immunity.</li> <li>A. As used in this section:</li> <li>"Certified substance abuse connestor" means a person crified to provide substance abuse counseling in a state-approved public or private substance abuse program or facility.</li> <li>"Clinical psychologist" means any person who is voluntarily or involuntarily receiving mental health service provider.</li> <li>"Clinical psychologist" means a person who practices clinical psychology as defined in § 54.1-3600.</li> <li>"Licensed practical nurse" means a person by practices coil work as defined in § 54.1-3700.</li> <li>"Licensed substance abuse treatment practitioner" means any person licensed to engage in the practice of substance abuse treatment as defined in § 54.1-3500.</li> <li>"Martiage and family therapist" means a person who by education and experience is professionally gualified and licensed in Virginia to provide counseling interventions designed to facilitate an individual's achievrement of human development goals and remediate mendal, emotional, or behavioral disorders and associated distresses which interfere with mental health professional, provider or "provider" refers to any of the following: (i) a person who provides sous a defined in § 54.1-3600.</li> <li>"Mental health service provider" or "provider" refers to any of the following: (i) a person who provides solar dows as defined in § 54.1-3600.</li> <li>"Mental health persons and person who practices social worker, (ii) a professional compation, school psychologist, or guist and how practices provides and formation, all of whose shareholders or members are so licensed to practice provider in § 54.1-3600.</li> <li>"Mental health person who practices spechology as defined in § 54.1-3600.</li> <li>"School psychologist" means a person who practices provider m</li></ul>
54 55 56	<ol> <li>Makes reasonable attempts to warn the potential victims or the parent or guardian of the potential victim if the potential victim is under the age of 18.</li> <li>Makes reasonable efforts to notify a law-enforcement official having jurisdiction in the client's or</li> </ol>

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potential victim's place of residence or place of work, or place of work of the parent or guardian if the 57 58 potential victim is under age 18, or both.

59 4. Takes steps reasonably available to the provider to prevent the client from using physical violence 60 or other means of harm to others until the appropriate law-enforcement agency can be summoned and 61 takes custody of the client.

5. Provides therapy or counseling to the client or patient in the session in which the threat has been 62 communicated until the mental health service provider reasonably believes that the client no longer has 63 64 the intent or the ability to carry out the threat. 65

D. A mental health service provider shall not be held civilly liable to any person for:

1. Breaching confidentiality with the limited purpose of protecting third parties by communicating the 66 67 threats described in subsection B made by his clients to potential third party victims or law-enforcement agencies or by taking any of the actions specified in subsection C. 68

2. Failing to predict, in the absence of a threat described in subsection B, that the client would cause 69 the third party serious physical harm. 70

3. Failing to take precautions other than those enumerated in subsection C to protect a potential third 71 72 party victim from the client's violent behavior.
