4	A BILL to amend and reenact § 46.2-1241 of the Code of Virginia, relating to issuance of disabled
5	parking placards.

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10	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
11	1. That § 46.2-1241 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows:
12	§ 46.2-1241. Issuance of disabled parking placards.
13	A. Upon application of a person with a disability that limits or impairs his ability to walk or that
14 15	creates a concern for his safety while walking, the Commissioner shall issue a permanent removable windshield placard for use on a passenger car or pickup or panel truck. The Commissioner shall require
16	that each original application be accompanied by a certification signed by a licensed physician, licensed
17	podiatrist, licensed chiropractor, licensed nurse practitioner, Θ licensed physician assistant, or licensed
18	clinical social worker on forms prescribed by the Commissioner that the applicant meets the definition
19	of "person with a disability that limits or impairs his ability to walk or that creates a concern for his
20	safety while walking" contained in § 46.2-1240.
21	1. The Commissioner shall provide for the renewal of such placards every five years. Applications
22 23	for renewals may require the applicant to certify that his disability is a permanent disability, but renewal applications need not be accompanied by a physician's, podiatrist's, chiropractor's, nurse practitioner's, or
23 24	physician assistant's, or licensed clinical social worker's certification of the applicant's disability. The
25	Commissioner shall work in consultation with the Medical Advisory Board for the Department to
26	develop a definition of "permanent disability" as used in this subdivision. Notwithstanding any contrary
27	provision of this chapter, no physician's, podiatrist's, chiropractor's, nurse practitioner's, or physician
28	assistant's, or licensed clinical social worker's certification of an applicant's disability shall be required
29	for the renewal of any disabled parking placard of an applicant to whom disabled parking license plates
30 31	have been issued under § 46.2-731.
32	2. The Commissioner shall charge a reasonable fee for each placard, but no fee shall be charged any person exempted from fees in § 46.2-739.
33	3. The placards shall be of a design approved by the Commissioner pursuant to the specifications and
34	definitions contained in § 46.2-1240.
35	B. Upon the application of a person with a disability that limits or impairs his ability to walk and
36	whose disability is temporary, the Commissioner shall issue a temporary removable windshield placard.
37	The application for a temporary removable windshield placard shall be accompanied by a certification
38 39	signed by a licensed physician, nurse practitioner, physician assistant, podiatrist, or <i>licensed clinical social worker</i> on forms prescribed by the Commissioner that the applicant meets the
40	definition of "person with a condition that limits or impairs his ability to walk" contained in § 46.2-1240
41	and shall also include the period of time that the physician, podiatrist, or chiropractor, or licensed
42	clinical social worker determines the applicant will have the disability, not to exceed six months.
43	1. A licensed physician, nurse practitioner, physician assistant, podiatrist, or chiropractor may certify
44	up to 15 days in advance of an applicant's medical procedure that an applicant will meet the definition
45	of "person with a condition that limits or impairs his ability to walk" and that the disability will be
46 47	temporary. Any licensed physician, nurse practitioner, physician assistant, podiatrist, or chiropractor who certifies an applicant's disability in advance of a medical procedure shall provide the period of time for
48	which the physician, nurse practitioner, physician assistant, podiatrist, or chiropractor has determined that
49	the applicant will have the disability, not to exceed six months. The Commissioner will mail the
50	temporary placard to the applicant.
51	2. The temporary removable windshield placard shall be valid for the period of time for which the
52 52	physician, podiatrist, or chiropractor, or licensed clinical social worker has determined that the applicant
53 54	will have the disability, not to exceed six months from the date of issuance. 3. The Commissioner shall provide for a reasonable fee to be charged for the placard. The placards
54 55	shall be of a design approved by the Commissioner pursuant to the specifications and definitions
56	contained in § 46.2-1240.
57	C. On application, the Commissioner shall issue to hospitals, hospices, nursing homes, and other
58	institutions and organizations meeting criteria determined by the Commissioner organizational removable

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59 windshield placards, as provided for in the foregoing provisions of this section, for use by volunteers 60 when transporting disabled persons in passenger vehicles and pickup or panel trucks owned by such 61 volunteers. The provisions of this section relating to other windshield placards issued under this section 62 shall also apply, mutatis mutandis, to windshield placards issued to these institutions and organizations, 63 except that windshield placards issued to institutions and agencies, in addition to their expiration date, 64 shall bear the name of the institution or organization whose volunteers will be using the windshield 65 placards rather than the name, age, and sex of the person to whom issued.

66 1. The Commissioner shall provide for the renewal of such placards every five years.

67 2. The placards shall be of a design approved by the Commissioner pursuant to the specifications and definitions contained in § 46.2-1240.

69 D. No person shall use or display an organizational removable windshield placard, permanent70 removable windshield placard or temporary removable windshield placard beyond its expiration date.

E. Organizational removable windshield placards, permanent removable windshield placards and temporary removable windshield placards shall be displayed in such a manner that they may be viewed from the front and rear of the vehicle and be hanging from the rearview mirror of a vehicle utilizing a parking space reserved for persons with disabilities that limit or impair their ability to walk. When there is no rearview mirror, the placard shall be displayed on the vehicle's dashboard. No placard shall be displayed from the rearview mirror while a vehicle is in motion.
