17104151D **SENATE BILL NO. 1403** 1 2 AMENDMENT IN THE NATURE OF A SUBSTITUTE 3 (Proposed by the Senate Committee on Education and Health 4 on January 19, 2017) 5 (Patron Prior to Substitute—Senator Dunnavant) A BILL to amend and reenact §§ 2.2-4006 and 54.1-3443 of the Code of Virginia, relating to 6 7 descheduling or rescheduling of cannabidiol. 8 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia: 9 1. That §§ 2.2-4006 and 54.1-3443 of the Code of Virginia are amended and reenacted as follows: 10 § 2.2-4006. Exemptions from requirements of this article. 11 A. The following agency actions otherwise subject to this chapter and § 2.2-4103 of the Virginia Register Act shall be exempted from the operation of this article: 12 13 1. Agency orders or regulations fixing rates or prices. 14 2. Regulations that establish or prescribe agency organization, internal practice or procedures, 15 including delegations of authority. 3. Regulations that consist only of changes in style or form or corrections of technical errors. Each 16 17 promulgating agency shall review all references to sections of the Code of Virginia within their regulations each time a new supplement or replacement volume to the Code of Virginia is published to 18 19 ensure the accuracy of each section or section subdivision identification listed. 20 4. Regulations that are: 21 a. Necessary to conform to changes in Virginia statutory law or the appropriation act where no 22 agency discretion is involved. However, such regulations shall be filed with the Registrar within 90 days 23 of the law's effective date; 24 b. Required by order of any state or federal court of competent jurisdiction where no agency 25 discretion is involved; or 26 c. Necessary to meet the requirements of federal law or regulations, provided such regulations do not 27 differ materially from those required by federal law or regulation, and the Registrar has so determined in 28 writing. Notice of the proposed adoption of these regulations and the Registrar's determination shall be 29 published in the Virginia Register not less than 30 days prior to the effective date of the regulation. 30 5. Regulations of the Board of Agriculture and Consumer Services adopted pursuant to subsection B of § 3.2-3929 or clause (v) or (vi) of subsection C of § 3.2-3931 after having been considered at two or 31 32 more Board meetings and one public hearing. 6. Regulations of the regulatory boards served by (i) the Department of Labor and Industry pursuant 33 34 to Title 40.1 and (ii) the Department of Professional and Occupational Regulation or the Department of 35 Health Professions pursuant to Title 54.1 that are limited to reducing fees charged to regulants and 36 applicants. 37 7. The development and issuance of procedural policy relating to risk-based mine inspections by the 38 Department of Mines, Minerals and Energy authorized pursuant to §§ 45.1-161.82 and 45.1-161.292:55. 39 8. General permits issued by the (a) State Air Pollution Control Board pursuant to Chapter 13 40 (§ 10.1-1300 et seq.) of Title 10.1 or (b) State Water Control Board pursuant to the State Water Control 41 Law (§ 62.1-44.2 et seq.), Chapter 24 (§ 62.1-242 et seq.) of Title 62.1 and Chapter 25 (§ 62.1-254 et seq.) of Title 62.1, (c) Virginia Soil and Water Conservation Board pursuant to the Dam Safety Act 42 (§ 10.1-604 et seq.), and (d) the development and issuance of general wetlands permits by the Marine 43 44 Resources Commission pursuant to subsection B of § 28.2-1307, if the respective Board or Commission (i) provides a Notice of Intended Regulatory Action in conformance with the provisions of 45 § 2.2-4007.01, (ii) following the passage of 30 days from the publication of the Notice of Intended 46 47 Regulatory Action forms a technical advisory committee composed of relevant stakeholders, including potentially affected citizens groups, to assist in the development of the general permit, (iii) provides **48** 49 notice and receives oral and written comment as provided in § 2.2-4007.03, and (iv) conducts at least 50 one public hearing on the proposed general permit. 51 9. The development and issuance by the Board of Education of guidelines on constitutional rights 52 and restrictions relating to the recitation of the pledge of allegiance to the American flag in public 53 schools pursuant to § 22.1-202. 54 10. (Effective until October 1, 2016) Regulations of the Board of the Virginia College Savings Plan 55 adopted pursuant to § 23-38.77. 10. (Effective October 1, 2016) Regulations of the Board of the Virginia College Savings Plan 56 57 adopted pursuant to § 23.1-704. 11. Regulations of the Marine Resources Commission. 58

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59 12. Regulations adopted by the Board of Housing and Community Development pursuant to (i)

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60 Statewide Fire Prevention Code (§ 27-94 et seq.), (ii) the Industrialized Building Safety Law (§ 36-70 et seq.), (iii) the Uniform Statewide Building Code (§ 36-97 et seq.), and (iv) § 36-98.3, provided the 61 Board (a) provides a Notice of Intended Regulatory Action in conformance with the provisions of 62 63 § 2.2-4007.01, (b) publishes the proposed regulation and provides an opportunity for oral and written 64 comments as provided in § 2.2-4007.03, and (c) conducts at least one public hearing as provided in 65 §§ 2.2-4009 and 36-100 prior to the publishing of the proposed regulations. Notwithstanding the 66 provisions of this subdivision, any regulations promulgated by the Board shall remain subject to the provisions of § 2.2-4007.06 concerning public petitions, and §§ 2.2-4013 and 2.2-4014 concerning 67 68 review by the Governor and General Assembly.

13. Amendments to regulations of the Board to schedule a substance in Schedule I or II pursuant to 69 70 subsection D or E of § 54.1-3443.

14. Waste load allocations adopted, amended, or repealed by the State Water Control Board pursuant 71 72 to the State Water Control Law (§ 62.1-44.2 et seq.), including but not limited to Article 4.01 (§ 62.1-44.19:4 et seq.) of the State Water Control Law, if the Board (i) provides public notice in the 73 74 Virginia Register; (ii) if requested by the public during the initial public notice 30-day comment period, forms an advisory group composed of relevant stakeholders; (iii) receives and provides summary 75 response to written comments; and (iv) conducts at least one public meeting. Notwithstanding the 76 provisions of this subdivision, any such waste load allocations adopted, amended, or repealed by the 77 78 Board shall be subject to the provisions of §§ 2.2-4013 and 2.2-4014 concerning review by the Governor 79 and General Assembly.

80 15. Regulations of the Workers' Compensation Commission adopted pursuant to § 65.2-605, including 81 regulations that adopt, amend, adjust, or repeal Virginia fee schedules for medical services, provided the 82 Workers' Compensation Commission (i) utilizes a regulatory advisory panel constituted as provided in subdivision F 2 of § 65.2-605 to assist in the development of such regulations and (ii) provides an 83 84 opportunity for public comment on the regulations prior to adoption.

85 B. Whenever regulations are adopted under this section, the agency shall state as part thereof that it 86 will receive, consider and respond to petitions by any interested person at any time with respect to 87 reconsideration or revision. The effective date of regulations adopted under this section shall be in 88 accordance with the provisions of § 2.2-4015, except in the case of emergency regulations, which shall 89 become effective as provided in subsection B of § 2.2-4012.

90 C. A regulation for which an exemption is claimed under this section or § 2.2-4002 or 2.2-4011 and 91 that is placed before a board or commission for consideration shall be provided at least two days in 92 advance of the board or commission meeting to members of the public that request a copy of that 93 regulation. A copy of that regulation shall be made available to the public attending such meeting. 94

§ 54.1-3443. Board to administer article.

95 A. The Board shall administer this article and may add substances to or deschedule or reschedule all 96 substances enumerated in the schedules in this article pursuant to the procedures of the Administrative 97 Process Act (§ 2.2-4000 et seq.). In making a determination regarding a substance, the Board shall 98 consider the following:

- 99 1. The actual or relative potential for abuse;
- 2. The scientific evidence of its pharmacological effect, if known; 100
- 3. The state of current scientific knowledge regarding the substance; 101
- 102 4. The history and current pattern of abuse;
- 103 5. The scope, duration, and significance of abuse;
- 104 6. The risk to the public health;
- 105 7. The potential of the substance to produce psychic or physical dependence; and
- 106 8. Whether the substance is an immediate precursor of a substance already controlled under this 107 article.
- 108 B. After considering the factors enumerated in subsection A, the Board shall make findings and issue 109 a regulation controlling the substance if it finds the substance has a potential for abuse.

110 C. If the Board designates a substance as an immediate precursor, substances which are precursors of 111 the controlled precursor shall not be subject to control solely because they are precursors of the 112 controlled precursor.

D. If the Board, in consultation with the Department of Forensic Science, determines the substance 113 114 shall be placed into Schedule I or II pursuant to § 54.1-3445 or 54.1-3447, the Board may amend its regulations pursuant to Article 2 (§ 2.2-4006 et seq.) of the Administrative Process Act. Prior to making 115 116 such amendments, the Board shall conduct a public hearing. At least 30 days prior to conducting such hearing, it shall post notice of the hearing on the Virginia Regulatory Town Hall and shall send notice 117 of the hearing to any persons requesting to be notified of a regulatory action. In the notice, the Board 118 shall include a list of all substances it intends to schedule by regulation. The Board shall notify the 119 120 House Courts of Justice and Senate Courts of Justice Committees of any new substance added to Schedule I or II pursuant to this subsection. Any substance added to Schedule I or II pursuant to this 121

subsection shall remain on Schedule I or II for a period of 18 months. Upon expiration of such 18-month period, such substance shall be descheduled unless a general law is enacted adding such substance to Schedule I or II. Nothing in this subsection shall preclude the Board from adding substances to or descheduling or rescheduling all substances enumerated in the schedules pursuant to the provisions of subsections A, B, and E.

127 E. If any substance is designated, rescheduled, or descheduled as a controlled substance under federal 128 law and notice of such action is given to the Board, the Board may similarly control the substance under 129 this chapter after the expiration of $\frac{120}{30}$ days from publication in the Federal Register of the *a* final or 130 interim final order or rule designating a substance as a controlled substance or rescheduling or 131 descheduling a substance without following the provisions specified in subsections A and \vec{B} by 132 amending its regulations in accordance with the requirements of Article 2 (§ 2.2-4006 et seq.) of the 133 Administrative Process Act. Prior to making such amendments, the Board shall conduct a public hearing. At least 30 days prior to conducting such hearing, the Board shall post notice of the hearing 134 on the Virginia Regulatory Town Hall and shall send notice of the hearing to any persons requesting to 135 be notified of a regulatory action. The Board shall include a list of all substances it intends to schedule 136 137 by regulation in such notice.

F. Authority to control under this section does not extend to distilled spirits, wine, malt beverages, ortobacco as those terms are defined or used in Title 4.1.

G. The Board shall exempt any nonnarcotic substance from a schedule if such substance may, under
the provisions of the federal Food, Drug and Cosmetic Act (21 U.S.C. § 301 et seq.) or state law, be
lawfully sold over the counter without a prescription.
