AMENDMENT IN THE NATURE OF A SUBSTITUTE

2 3 4 5 6 A BILL to direct the Virginia Community College System to establish the Temporary Assistance for 7 Needy Families Scholarship Pilot Program. 8

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:

9 **1.** § 1. That the Virginia Community College System (VCCS) shall establish a three-year pilot program, to be referred to as the Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) Scholarship Pilot Program 10 (the Program), beginning in 2017 for the purpose of providing access to postsecondary educational opportunities to students living in poverty. The Program shall provide to selected students who meet the 11 12 TANF eligibility requirements prepaid scholarships to select community colleges in the Virginia 13 14 Community College System. Program funds shall be used to make payments for the costs of tuition and 15 books in advance of a student's enrollment in a participating community college.

16 § 2. The Program shall be funded with federal TANF block grant funds appropriated for this purpose. Such funds shall be used to provide to 200 students participating in the program a maximum 17 of \$4,000 each per year. Such funds may be paid directly to participating community colleges or 18 directed to Virginia programs authorized pursuant to § 529 of the Internal Revenue Code. 19

20 § 3. The Program shall be implemented at two or more community colleges, at least one of which 21 shall be located in an urban area and at least one of which shall be located in a rural area. 22 Community colleges participating or applying to participate in the Program shall submit information 23 outlining educational and vocational programs offered at the applying or participating community 24 college that have been shown, through surveys or other assessments, to lead to self-sufficiency for 25 enrolled students, including programs in which students receive a degree or qualifications necessary to 26 obtain licensure or certification in a specific field of employment.

27 § 4. VCCS and the Virginia Department of Social Services (the Department) shall enter into a 28 memorandum of understanding establishing the parameters of the Program and the method for selecting 29 students to participate in the Program. VCCS shall monitor, record, and analyze the outcomes of all 30 students participating in the Program.

31 § 5. VCCS shall report to the Governor and the General Assembly no later than December 1 of each 32 year of the Program. Such report shall include (i) the number of eligible students who applied to 33 participate in the Program, (ii) the number of students selected to participate in the Program, (iii) the 34 criteria for selection and other nonidentifying statistical information about students selected to 35 participate in the Program, (iv) student outcome analysis and evaluation, (v) methods used to assess 36 student outcomes, (vi) information regarding the community colleges selected to participate in the Program and the areas in which such community colleges are located, (vii) actual expenditures for the 37 38 Program, and (viii) any other information deemed necessary by VCCS to evaluate the effectiveness of 39 the Program.

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
