5 6	(Patron Prior to Substitute—Senator Surovell) A BILL to amend and reenact § 46.2-1078.1 of the Code of Virginia, relating to hands-free operation of
7	handheld personal communications devices in motor vehicles; exceptions; penalty.
8	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
9	1. That § 46.2-1078.1 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows:
10	§ 46.2-1078.1. Use of handheld personal communications devices in certain motor vehicles;
11	exceptions; penalty.
12 13	A. It is unlawful for any person to operate a moving motor vehicle on the highways in the Commonwealth while using any handheld personal communications device to:
13	1. Manually enter multiple letters or text in the device as a means of communicating with another
15	person; or
16	2. Read any email or text message transmitted to the device or stored within the device, provided
17	that this prohibition shall not apply to any name or number stored within the device nor to any caller
18	identification information unless the handheld personal communications device is specifically designed
19 20	and configured to allow voice and hands-free operation and the device is being used in that manner. B. The provisions of this section shall not apply to:
<b>2</b> 0 <b>2</b> 1	1. The operator of any emergency vehicle while he is engaged in the performance of his official
22	duties;
23	2. An operator who is lawfully parked or stopped;
24	3. The use of factory-installed or aftermarket global positioning systems (GPS) or wireless
25 26	communications devices used to transmit or receive data as part of a digital dispatch system; or 4. The use of a handheld personal communications device for purposes of navigation or generating
27 27	audio transmission, provided that such device is physically mounted to a vehicle;
28	5. The use of a citizens band radio;
29	6. Vehicles used or operated by federally licensed amateur radio operators (i) while participating in
30	emergency communications or drills on behalf of federal, state, or local authorities or (ii) to provide
31 32	communications services to localities in the Commonwealth for public service events, including marathons, footraces, or activities authorized by the Department of Transportation or the locality in
33	which the event is being conducted;
34	7. An operator who activates, deactivates, or initiates a factory-installed feature or function on the
35	vehicle; or
36	8. Any person using a handheld personal communications device to report an emergency.
37 38	C. A violation of this section is <i>shall be punishable as follows:</i> 1. As a traffic infraction punishable, for a first offense, by a fine of \$125 and, for a second or
39	subsequent offense, by a fine of \$250; or
40	2. If such offense occurs concurrently with an additional traffic offense set forth in Title 18.2 or
41	46.2, or a valid local ordinance governing traffic, or proximately results in an accident, it shall be
42	punishable as reckless driving as set forth in § 46.2-868.
43 44	<ul><li>D. For the purposes of this section, "emergency vehicle" means:</li><li>1. Any law-enforcement vehicle operated by or under the direction of a federal, state, or local</li></ul>
45	law-enforcement officer while engaged in the performance of official duties;
46	2. Any regional detention center vehicle operated by or under the direction of a correctional officer
47	responding to an emergency call or operating in an emergency situation;
48	3. Any vehicle used to fight fire, including publicly owned state forest warden vehicles, when
49 50	traveling in response to a fire alarm or emergency call;
50 51	4. Any emergency medical services vehicle designed or used for the principal purpose of <i>supplying resuscitation or</i> emergency medical services <i>relief</i> where human life is endangered;
52	5. Any Department of Emergency Management vehicle or Office of Emergency Medical Services
53	vehicle, when responding to an emergency call or operating in an emergency situation;
54	6. Any Department of Corrections vehicle designated by the Director of the Department of
55 56	Corrections, when (i) responding to an emergency call at a correctional facility, (ii) participating in a drug related investigation (iii) purguing assances from a correctional facility or (iv) responding to a
56 57	drug-related investigation, (iii) pursuing escapees from a correctional facility, or (iv) responding to a request for assistance from a law-enforcement officer; and
58	7. Any vehicle authorized to be equipped with alternating, blinking, or flashing red or red and white
59	secondary warning lights pursuant to § 46.2-1029.2.
