4	A BILL to amend and reenact §§ 23.1-3120, 23.1-3121, and 23.1-3122 of the Code of Virginia, relating
5	to the Southern Virginia Higher Education Center; duties and membership.

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10	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
11	1. That §§ 23.1-3120, 23.1-3121, and 23.1-3122 of the Code of Virginia are amended and reenacted
12	as follows:
13	§ 23.1-3120. Southern Virginia Higher Education Center established; duties.
14	The Southern Virginia Higher Education Center (the Center) is established as an educational
15	institution in the Commonwealth. The Center shall:
16	1. Encourage the expansion of higher education, including adult and continuing education and
17	associate, undergraduate, and graduate degree programs in the region and foster partnerships between the
18	public and private sectors to enhance higher education in the Southside region;
19	2. Coordinate the development and delivery of continuing education programs offered by the
20	educational institutions serving the region;
21	3. Facilitate the delivery of teacher training programs leading to licensure and graduate degrees;
22	4. Encourage and coordinate the development and delivery of workforce training with a focus on
23	regional and statewide critical shortage areas as well as the needs of industry;
24	5. Serve as a resource and referral center by maintaining and disseminating information on existing
25	educational programs and resources; and
26	5. 6. Develop, in coordination with the Council, specific goals for higher education in Southside
27	Virginia.
28	§ 23.1-3121. Board of trustees.
29	A. The Center shall be governed by a board of trustees (the board) consisting of 15 members as
30	follows: two members of the House of Delegates to be appointed by the Speaker of the House of
31	Delegates in accordance with the principles of proportional representation contained in the Rules of the
32	House of Delegates; one member of the Senate to be appointed by the Senate Committee on Rules; the
33	Director of the Council or his designee; the Chancellor of the Virginia Community College System or
34	his designee; the presidents of Longwood University, Danville Community College, and Southside
35	Virginia Community College or their designees; the division superintendent of Halifax County Public
36	Schools; and six seven nonlegislative citizen members to be appointed by the Governor, including two
37	members of the Southern Virginia Higher Education Foundation, one superintendent of a school division
38	located in the Southside region, and four representatives of business and industry. The Speaker of the
39	House of Delegates may appoint an alternate for one delegate appointed to the board. The alternate shall
40	serve a term coincident with the term of the delegate and has the power to act in his absence. The
41	Senate Committee on Rules may appoint an alternate for the senator appointed to the board. The
42	alternate shall serve a term coincident with the term of the senator and may act in his absence.
43	Nonlegislative citizen members of the board shall be chosen from among residents of the Southside
44	region of the Commonwealth and shall be citizens of the Commonwealth. However, an individual who
45	does not reside in the Southside region may serve as a representative of business and industry if he
46	either (i) owns a business headquartered or otherwise operating in Southside Virginia or (ii) serves as a
47	member of the board of directors or senior management of a business headquartered or otherwise
48	operating in the Southside region.
49	B. Legislative members and the representatives of the Council, the System, and the named
50	institutions of higher education shall serve terms coincident with their terms of office. Nonlegislative
51	citizen members shall be appointed for terms of four years. Appointments to fill vacancies, other than by
52	expiration of a term, shall be for the unexpired terms. Vacancies shall be filled in the same manner as
53 54	the original appointments.
54	No nonlegislative citizen member is eligible to serve more than two consecutive four-year terms;
55 56	however, a member appointed to serve an unexpired term is eligible to serve two consecutive four-year
56 57	terms immediately succeeding such unexpired term.
57 58	C. Nonlegislative citizen members are not entitled to compensation for their services. Legislative members of the board shall be compensated as provided in § 30-19.12. All members of the board shall

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be reimbursed for all reasonable and necessary expenses incurred in the performance of their duties in
the work of the Center as provided in §§ 2.2-2813 and 2.2-2825. The funding for the costs of
compensation and expenses of the members shall be provided by the Center.

62 D. The board shall elect a chairman and a vice-chairman from among its membership.

63 § 23.1-3122. Powers of the board.

A. The board has, in addition to its other powers, all the corporate powers given to corporations by
the provisions of Title 13.1, except in those cases where, by the express terms of its provisions, it is
confined to corporations created under that title.

B. The board may accept, execute, and administer any trust in which it may have an interest underthe terms of the instrument creating the trust.

69 C. The board may establish and administer agreements with public institutions of higher education 70 and private institutions of higher education for the provision of associate, undergraduate, and graduate 71 degree instructional programs at the Center. The board shall collaborate with local comprehensive 72 community colleges to meet specialized noncredit workforce training needs identified by industry. 73 However, if local community colleges are unable to meet identified industry needs, then the board may 74 collaborate with other education providers or may provide Center-delivered specialized noncredit 75 workforce training independent of local comprehensive community colleges.

D. The board, on behalf of the Center, may apply for, accept, and expend gifts, grants, or donations
 from public or private sources to enable it to carry out its purposes.

78 2. That the provisions of this act shall not affect members of the board of trustees of the Southern

79 Virginia Higher Education Center whose terms have not expired as of July 1, 2017. However, the

80 division superintendent of Halifax County Public Schools shall continue to serve until the

81 Governor appoints a public school superintendent from the Southside region of the 82 Commonwealth. Such individual shall be eligible for such appointment.
