4	A BILL to amend and reenact § 58.1-439.12:03 of the Code of Virginia, relating to motion picture
5	production tax credit.

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10	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
11	1. That § 58.1-439.12:03 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows:
12 13	§ 58.1-439.12:03. Motion picture production tax credit.
13 14	A. For taxable years beginning on and after January 1, 2011, but prior to January 1, 2019 2022, any motion picture production company with qualifying expanses of at least \$250,000 with respect to a
14	motion picture production company with qualifying expenses of at least \$250,000 with respect to a motion picture production filmed in Virginia shall be allowed a refundable credit against the taxes
15 16	imposed by § 58.1-320 or 58.1-400 in an amount equal to 15 percent of the production company's
17	qualifying expenses or 20 percent of such expenses if the production is filmed in an economically
18	distressed area of the Commonwealth. The Virginia Economic Development Partnership Authority shall
19	designate which areas of the Commonwealth are deemed to be economically distressed areas. The credit
20	shall be computed based on all of the taxpayer's qualifying expenses incurred with respect to the
21	production, not just the qualifying expenses incurred during the taxable year. The refundable tax credits
22	allowed under this section are for one tax year only. Where a motion picture production continues for
23	more than one year, a separate application for each tax year the production continues must be made. The
24	grant of a refundable tax credit for a motion picture film production does not create a presumption that
25	the production will receive a refundable tax credit for subsequent tax years. Effective on January 1,
26 27	2013, for purposes of eligibility for refundable tax credits, a motion picture film production shall include digital interactive media production.
28	"Qualifying expenses" means the sum of the following amounts spent in the Commonwealth by a
20 29	production company in connection with the production of a motion picture filmed in the
3 0	Commonwealth:
31	1. Goods and services leased or purchased. For goods with a purchase price of \$25,000 or more, the
32	amount included in qualifying expenses is the purchase price less the fair market value of the good at
33	the time the production is completed.
34	2. Compensation and wages, except in the case of each individual who directly or indirectly receives
35	compensation in excess of \$1 million for personal services with respect to a single production. In such a
36	case, only the first \$1 million of salary shall be considered a qualifying expense. An individual is
37 38	deemed to receive compensation indirectly when a production company pays a personal service company or an employee leasing company that pays the individual.
39	B. 1. In addition to the refundable credit authorized under subsection A, such production company
40	shall be allowed an additional refundable credit equal to 10 percent of the total aggregate payroll for
41	Virginia residents employed in connection with the production of a film in the Commonwealth when
42	total production costs in the Commonwealth are at least \$250,000 but not more than \$1 million. This
43	additional credit shall be equal to 20 percent of the total aggregate payroll for Virginia residents
44	employed in connection with such production when total production costs in the Commonwealth exceed
45	\$1 million.
46	2. In addition to the credits authorized under subsection A and subdivision B 1, such production
47 48	company shall be allowed an additional refundable credit equal to 10 percent of the total aggregate
40 49	payroll for Virginia residents employed for the first time as actors or members of a production crew in connection with the production of a film in the Commonwealth.
49 50	C. 1. For purposes of this section, in the case of an episodic television series, an entire season of
50 51	episodes shall be deemed to be one production.
52	2. No credit shall be allowed under this section for any production that (i) is political advertising, (ii)
53	is a television production of a news program or live sporting event, (iii) contains obscene material, or
54	(iv) is a reality television production.
55	D. 1. The issuance of refundable tax credits under this section shall be in accordance with
56	procedures, qualifying criteria, and deadlines established by the Department and the Virginia Film
57	Office. The qualifying criteria established by the Virginia Film Office shall take into account whether
58	the production involves physical production within the Commonwealth of Virginia, the number of

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59 residents of Virginia that will be employed in the production and the level of compensation they will be paid, the extent to which the production will contribute to the support and expansion of existing 60 production companies in Virginia, the extent to which the production will impact existing local 61 62 businesses and the local economy, the extent to which the production will involve existing and new 63 companies located in Virginia, and other relevant considerations. The taxpaver shall apply for a credit by 64 submitting such forms as prescribed by the Virginia Film Office, prior to the start of production in 65 Virginia.

66 2. Any taxpayer seeking credits under this section must enter into a memorandum of understanding with the Virginia Film Office that at a minimum provides the requirements that the taxpayer must meet 67 in order to receive the credits, including but not limited to the estimated amount of money to be spent 68 69 in Virginia, the timeline for completing production in Virginia, and the maximum amount of credits 70 allocated to the taxpayer.

71 3. Once the taxpayer has satisfied all of the requirements in the memorandum of understanding to the satisfaction of the Virginia Film Office and completed production in Virginia, the taxpayer may claim 72 73 the applicable amount of credits up to the amount that has been allocated by the Virginia Film Office on 74 a return filed for the taxable year in which the Virginia production activities are completed. The return 75 must state the name of the production, provide a description of the production, and include a detailed accounting of the qualifying expenses with respect to which a credit is claimed. 76

77 E. A taxpayer allowed a credit under this section must maintain and make available for inspection 78 any information or records required by the Tax Commissioner. The taxpayer has the burden of proving 79 eligibility for a credit and the amount of the credit. The Tax Commissioner shall consult with the 80 Virginia Film Office in order to determine the amount of qualifying expenses.

F. For purposes of this section, the amount of any credit attributable to a partnership, electing small 81 business corporation (S corporation), or limited liability company may be allocated to the individual 82 83 partners, shareholders, or members, respectively, in proportion to their ownership or interest in such 84 business entities.

85 G. The total amount of credits allocated to all taxpayers under this section shall not exceed \$2.5 million in the 2010-2012 biennium, \$5 million in the 2012-2014 biennium, and \$6.5 million in fiscal 86 87 year 2015 and each fiscal year thereafter.

88 H. The Department of Taxation, in consultation with the Virginia Film Office, must publish by 89 November 1 of each year for the 12-month period ending the preceding December 31 the following 90 information: 91

1. Location of sites used in a production for which a credit was claimed;

92 2. Qualifying expenses for which a credit was claimed, classified by whether the expenses were for 93 goods, services, or compensation paid by the production company;

94 3. Number of people employed in the Commonwealth with respect to credits claimed; and

95 4. Total cost to the Commonwealth's general fund of the credits claimed.

Notwithstanding any provision of § 58.1-3 or any other law, such information shall be published by 96 the Department, even if such information is not classified, so as to prevent the identification of 97 98 particular taxpayers, reports, or returns and items.

99 I. The Tax Commissioner shall develop guidelines implementing the provisions of this section, including but not limited to the definition of "qualifying expenses" and setting forth the recordkeeping 100 101 requirements applicable to production companies claiming this credit. Such guidelines shall be exempt

from the provisions of the Administrative Process Act (§ 2.2-4000 et seq.). 102
