11	1. That § 46.2-380 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows:
12	§ 46.2-380. Reports made under certain sections open to inspection by certain persons; copies;
13	maintenance of reports and photographs for three-year period.
14	A. Any report of an accident made pursuant to § 46.2-372, 46.2-373, 46.2-375, or 46.2-377 shall be
15	maintained by the Department in either hard copy or electronic form for a period of at least 36 months
16	from the date of the accident and shall be open to the inspection of any person involved or injured in
17	the accident or as a result thereof, or his attorney or any authorized representative of any insurance
18	carrier reasonably anticipating exposure to civil liability as a consequence of the accident or to which
19	the person has applied for issuance or renewal of a policy of automobile insurance. The Commissioner
20	shall on written request of the person or attorney or any authorized representative of any insurance
21	carrier reasonably anticipating exposure to civil liability as a consequence of the accident or to which
22 23	the person has applied for issuance or renewal of a policy of automobile insurance, furnish a copy of the report within five days of the request, in either hard copy or electronic form, at the expense of the
