4	Requesting the Virginia Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services to study spay-neuter
5	programs in the Commonwealth. Report.

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10	WHEREAS, the creation of public and private programs for the spaying and neutering of companion
11	animals has resulted in dramatic declines in the pet population; and
12	WHEREAS, Virginia law allows localities to incentivize spaying and neutering of companion animals
13	through the localities' licensing programs; and
14	WHEREAS, Virginia provides funding for spay-neuter programs through the Animal Friendly special
15	license plate program; and
16 17	WHEREAS, Virginia allows for voluntary contributions to support spay-neuter programs through the
17	state income tax check-off system; and WHEREAS, support for spay-neuter programs in Virginia is managed by a variety of state and local
19	agencies; and
20	WHEREAS, the present system, composed of a variety of spay-neuter programs, lacks accountability
21	and makes comprehensive data collection difficult; now, therefore, be it
22	RESOLVED by the Senate, the House of Delegates concurring, That the Virginia Department of
23	Agriculture and Consumer Services be requested to study spay-neuter programs in the Commonwealth.
24	In conducting its study, the Virginia Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services (the
25 26	Department) shall review the effectiveness of public and private spay-neuter programs in the Commonwealth, the availability of spay-neuter services in low-income communities, and the operation of
20 27	Virginia's Animal Friendly license plate program and shall assess the feasibility of establishing a
28	statewide system for promoting and funding the spaying and neutering of companion animals.
<b>29</b>	The State Veterinarian shall appoint a board of advisors to assist the Department in its study. The
30	board of advisors shall include representatives of the Virginia Veterinary Medical Association, the
31	Virginia Federation of Humane Societies, the Virginia Farm Bureau, the Virginia Animal Control
32	Association, public and private animal shelters, and citizens experienced in animal welfare issues.
33	All agencies of the Commonwealth shall provide assistance to the Department for this study, upon
34 35	request. The Department shall complete its meetings by Nevember 30, 2017; shall report its findings and
35 36	The Department shall complete its meetings by November 30, 2017; shall report its findings and recommendations to the Chairmen of the Senate Committee on Agriculture, Conservation and Natural
37	Resources and the House Committee on Agriculture, Chesapeake and Natural Resources by December 1,
38	2017; and shall submit to the Governor and the General Assembly an executive summary and a report
39	of its findings and recommendations for publication as a House or Senate document. The executive
40	summary and report shall be submitted as provided in the procedures of the Division of Legislative
41	Automated Systems for the processing of legislative documents and reports no later than the first day of
42	the 2018 Regular Session of the General Assembly and shall be posted on the General Assembly's
43	website.
