**4. Title:** Certain sanitary landfills; gas collection and control system.

**5. Summary:** Requires any active sanitary landfill that receives more than 100,000 tons of solid waste per year and is located within one-half mile of any residence or residentially zoned property to install a landfill gas collection and control system by July 1, 2019.

**8. Fiscal Implications:** It is anticipated that any fiscal impact the bill may have on the Department of Environmental Quality can be absorbed within existing resources.
