5. Summary:

The current law establishes a process for the preparation of presentence investigation (PSI) reports for the use of the court in determining the appropriate sentence in criminal cases. The reports include the criminal history of the offender, as well as any other information that might be relevant for the court to consider. For numerous specified offenses, the law provides the court some discretion in ordering PSIs. The proposed legislation would make the following changes in those provisions:

8. Fiscal Implications:

The PSI is prepared by the probation and parole district office serving the court. By expanding the discretion of courts not to order PSIs in certain situations, the proposed legislation could result in a reduction in the caseload of those probation officers assigned to

prepare them. There is not enough information available to project the extent to which the required waivers would be granted and whether courts would accordingly dispense with ordering a PSI. Therefore, it is not possible to project the effect on probation officers' caseloads that would result from the proposed legislation.
