**8. Fiscal Implications:** According to the Office of the Executive Secretary of the Supreme Court (OES), the proposed legislation will require comprehensive information system enhancements as shown in the following table:

Currently, there are two courts (Fairfax and Alexandria) that do not use the OES case management system. The cost of data conversion, hosting and synchronization for these two courts is captured in this fiscal impact statement. However, if additional courts opt to use a private vendor, the fiscal impact to OES to comply with the requirements of the proposed legislation would be an additional \$183,600 per court which is not included in the expenditure impact of this fiscal impact statement.
