**3. Committee:** Courts of Justice

**4. Title:** Board of Pharmacy to deschedule or reschedule cannabidiol upon publication of an interim final rule.

**5. Summary:** Directs the Board of Pharmacy to initiate action to deschedule or reschedule cannabidiol or any product containing cannabidiol that has been approved as a prescription medication by the U.S. Food and Drug Administration pursuant to 21 U.S.C. § 360bb and 21 U.S.C. § 355 within 30 days of publication in the Federal Register of an interim final rule.

**8. Fiscal Implications:** This bill would not have a fiscal impact on the Commonwealth. Any costs to the Board of Pharmacy to initiate action to reschedule cannabidiol are minimal and can be absorbed by the agency.
