**4. Title:** Electric utility regulation; third party power purchase agreements.

**5. Summary:** Electric utility regulation; third party power purchase agreements. Authorizes individual retail customers of electric energy to own and operate, or contract with other persons to own, operate, or both, a renewable electrical generating facility under a third party power purchase agreement, on the customer's premises that meets the "eligible customer-generator" requirements for nonresidential customers and agricultural customers under the Commonwealth's net energy metering program.
