5.	<b>Summary:</b> The bill prohibits a person who issues tickets for admission to any sporting event, theatrical production, lecture, motion picture screening, or any other event that is oper to the public from selling tickets solely through a delivery method that substantially prevents the ticket purchaser from reselling the ticket on an Internet ticketing platform of the ticket purchaser's choice. The bill also prohibits a person from being penalized, discriminated against, or denied admission to an event solely on the basis that the person resold a ticket or purchased a resold ticket on a specific Internet ticketing platform. A person violating these prohibitions is subject to a civil penalty of not less than \$1,000 nor more than \$5,000.
