4. Title: Concealed handguns

5. Summary:

The proposed legislation would authorize any person 21 years old or older who is protected by a protective order, and who is not otherwise prohibited from possessing, purchasing, or transporting a firearm, to carry a concealed handgun, without a permit, for 45 days after the protective order was issued or until the order expires, whichever comes first. Furthermore, if the person covered by the protective order applies for a concealed handgun permit, that person may immediately carry a concealed handgun for an additional 45 days from the date of the application. The application shall serve as a de facto permit.

The legislation would require that any person issued a protective order or having submitted an application for a concealed handgun permit carry on his or her person a copy of the protective order or certified application at all times that he or she is carrying a concealed handgun. Failure to show the order or application, along with a photo identification upon demand to a law-enforcement officer would be punishable by a \$25 civil penalty, which would be paid into the state treasury.

It is not feasible to reliably estimate any additional revenue from the civil penalty provided in the legislation that might be deposited into the general fund.
