4. Title: DRIVE SMART Virginia Education Fund.

5. Summary: This bill establishes a method by which holders of an account for an electronic toll collection device that is the property of the Commonwealth may opt in to make a voluntary contribution through electronic means to the DRIVE SMART Virginia Education Fund (the Fund), created by the bill. The bill requires that contributions to the Fund be used solely for the purposes of supporting educational projects through DRIVE SMART Virginia.

7. Fiscal Impact Estimates: Final. See Item #8.

8. Fiscal Implications: The electronic toll collection devices in the bill are the E-ZPass transponders that work with toll systems in Virginia and other states on the East Coast. The Department of Motor Vehicles' (DMV) Customer Service Centers sell E-ZPass transponders to customers. The responsibility for setting up and administering the transfer of funds using the E-ZPass system would be the responsibility of the Virginia Department of Transportation. Neither agency anticipates a fiscal impact from this proposal.
