- 5. Summary: This bill combines the current property carrier and bulk property carrier authorities and eliminates the current license requirement for property brokers. The bill eliminates the requirement for the Department of Motor Vehicles to issue specially designated license plates for property-carrying vehicles operated for hire. The bill reduces insurance limits for carriers operating vehicles with a gross vehicle weight rating in excess of 7,500 pounds but not in excess of 10,000 pounds from \$750,000 to \$300,000. The bill reduces current liability coverage requirements for property carriers from \$750,000 to \$50,000 per person, \$100,000 per incident for death and bodily injury, and \$25,000 for property damage for passenger cars, motorcycles, autocycles, and vehicles with a gross vehicle weight rating of 7,500 pounds or less. The bill has a delayed effective date of October 1, 2017.

- **8. Fiscal Implications:** The Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV) estimates that it will incur a one-time expenditure of \$190,246 to implement the requirements of this legislation. It should be noted that the agency anticipated these costs as the study recommendations were discussed, and the legislation drafted. It was therefore able to reserve the resources necessary to implement the legislation.

- 11. Other Comments: This bill is similar to SB 1364.
