- 4. Title: Community services boards; preadmission screening; regional jail inmates
- **5. Summary:** Provides that the duties of a community services board include providing preadmission screening services to inmates incarcerated in a regional jail where the locality served by the community services board is a participant in such jail. The bill allows for one or more of the community services boards that serve such localities to enter into a joint agreement regarding the provision of such services. In the absence of an agreement, each community services board is responsible for providing services to inmates convicted in the locality served by the community services board.

** While officially take inmates from listed localities, inmate population has dropped therefore it is unclear how CSBs would be affected.

Currently, the CSB where the jail is located is responsible for prescreening anyone in the jail needing emergency mental health services. This legislation would require the jail from where the charges stem to either do the pre-screening themselves and/or enter into an agreement with the CSB where the jail is located to do the pre-screening for them (presumably at some cost).

In order to ensure availability at the CSBs listed above, and to cover increased demand, each of these CSBs would need at a minimum one additional pre-admission screener (full time equivalent) per additional jail that is being served. A total of 20 additional FTEs would be needed:

A conservative estimate would assume that one FTE would be needed for each of the 19 CSBs affected. In addition, Rappahannock-Rapidan would need a second screener to serve each of the additional regional jails.

It is estimated that the total cost per FTE would be \$85,667.

It is possible that additional positions would be needed to ensure 24 hour coverage, seven days a week.

While this bill would not necessarily cause a significant increase to the total number of prescreenings done by the CSBs, it will change the CSB responsible for conducting the evaluation. This bill may relieve some pressure on the CSBs that are currently conducting the prescreenings; however there are not adequate resources available to divert funds from those CSBs to others, as many only have one prescreener on staff at any particular shift,

who is also responsible for civil prescreenings.
