**4. Title:** Alcoholic beverage control; privileges of licensed art instruction studios

**5. Summary:** Expands the privileges of an art instruction studio licensee to allow the consumption of lawfully acquired wine or beer on its premises by any bona fide customer. The bill also permits the licensee to allow a bona fide customer to host a private gathering or special event where such customer has obtained a banquet or mixed beverage special events license.

Fiscal Implications:** According to the Department of Alcoholic Beverage Control (ABC), there are currently 7 licensed art instruction studios in the Commonwealth and 6 more studios have submitted applications that are pending approval. The substitute bill is expected to have a minimal impact on the ABC licensing and investigations divisions.
