2. Patron: Sturtevant

3. Committee: Passed Both Houses

4. Title: Alcoholic beverage control; walking tour permit.

5. Summary: Creates a new permit that allows tour companies guiding individuals for compensation on a culinary walking tour to one or more establishments to sell alcoholic beverages at retail for on-premises consumption to collect as one fee from tour participants (i) the licensee's fee for food and alcoholic beverages served as part of the tour and, (ii) a fee for the culinary walking tour service. The bill requires the tour company to remit to the licensee any fee collected for the alcoholic beverages served as part of the tour. Food cooked or prepared on the premises of such licensed establishments shall be served at each such establishment on tour.

8. Fiscal Implications: According to the Department of Alcoholic Beverage Control (ABC), the proposed bill will have an indeterminate impact on the agency's licensing and enforcement operations. It is uncertain as to the number of licensees that will apply for this new permit; therefore, the fiscal impact cannot be determined at this time.
