**4. Title:** Alcoholic beverage control; availability of food when spirits served.

**5. Summary:** Directs the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board to promulgate regulations that require mixed beverage licensees to have food, cooked or prepared on the licensed premises, available for on-premises consumption whenever spirits are sold or served. The bill requires that such food be available in all areas of the licensed premises in which spirits are sold or served.
