3. Committee: Passed both houses.

4. Title: Motor vehicle safety inspection data.

5. Summary: Authorizes the Superintendent of State Police to provide, upon request, verification of the inspection status of a vehicle and to charge a reasonable fee for providing such information. Any information provided cannot not include personal information. Fees shall not be charged to any official of the Commonwealth including court and police officials; officials of counties, cities, or towns; local government self-insurance pools; or the court, police, or licensing officials of other states or of the federal government, provided that the information requested is for official use and such officials do not charge the Commonwealth a fee for the provision of the same or substantially similar information.

6. Budget Amendment Necessary: No.

7. Fiscal Impact Estimates: Final. See below.

8. Fiscal Implications: The proposed bill would allow the Department of State Police (Department) to charge a reasonable fee for a request of motor vehicle inspection data. Revenue generated from the fee collected by the Department is to be paid into the state treasury and set aside as a special fund to be used to meet expenses of the Department. However, there is not enough information at this time to estimate the amount of revenue to be collected from such fees.

9. Specific Agency or Political Subdivisions Affected: Department of State Police.

10. Technical Amendment Necessary: No.

11. Other Comments: This bill is similar to HB2269.
