3. Committee: Courts of Justice

4. Title: Dismissal of certain traffic violations for proof of compliance with law.

5. Summary: This bill provides that a court may, in its discretion, dismiss a violation for failure to notify the Department of Motor Vehicles of change of address, for failing to register, title, or properly display license plates, for failure to pay local licensing fees or taxes, for failure to have certain safety equipment or having unsafe or defective equipment, or for improper tinting, if such a person can prove to the court compliance with the law after the traffic summons was issued and payment of court fees.

8. Fiscal Implications: A revenue impact is not anticipated from the bill and there will be no impact to the automated systems at the Department of Motor Vehicles.
